Structure, Governance and Management Governing Document

'The Church is governed in its temporal affairs by a Deacons' Court, which consists of the Minister, the Elders, and the Deacons. The Deacons are elected to office for the purpose of assisting in the management of the temporal affairs of the congregation.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

The Elders and Deacons are the Charity Trustees, and have responsibility for the administration of congregational finances. The Kirk Session consists of the Minister and 'the ruling Elders'. The Kirk Session shall determine the number of Elders required for the oversight of the congregation, and the time when a new election is to take place. The Minister is called by the congregation and is ordained (if not the case already) and inducted by the local Presbytery, and is directly accountable to it for the discharge of the duties of his or her office. The Minister is the Moderator of the Kirk Session. In a vacancy, Presbytery appoints an Interim Moderator who is the Moderator of the Kirk Session. Elders are elected for life and hold office till they cease to be members of the congregation, or their resignation is accepted, or they are deposed or otherwise removed from office. The Deacons' Court consists of the Minister, the Elders, and the Deacons. The Deacons are elected and ordained to assist in the management of the temporal affairs of the congregation. The Kirk Session determines when it is expedient to have an election of Deacons, and determines also the number required, which ought to be conformable to the size and circumstances of the congregation. Deacons are elected and ordained for life to office by the Kirk Session, and continue in office until ceasing to be a member of the congregation, or resigning from office, or are removed or otherwise deposed.

Organisational Structure

The Deacons Court is chaired by the Minister (or Interim Moderator) and meets four to five times in a year, usually February, April, October and December, plus June, if business dictates. The Court presently has three sub-committees: Finance, Property and General Support, which meet as required to investigate issues relating to respective remits, and to produce a report for approval at the full Court. Certain responsibilities are delegated to the Minister and the Clerk to the Court, during the summer period, when the Court does not meet. The Treasurer has power to make small routine payments without reference to the Court.

The Kirk Session, which usually meets five times a year, and more if required, is responsible for spiritual affairs within the church.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a National Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

St Columba's meets for worship on a Sunday morning in the Peter Memorial Building. In addition, at this time, there is a Junior Church and Bible Class, which are open to all the young people of the area, and a crèche facility is available for parents with young children who wish to attend morning worship. An Easter Holiday Club for children of primary school age has developed in recent years and the church is developing a family ministry through the 'Messy Church' programme. The church supports and hosts events before Christmas, Easter and Pentecost for up to senior primary school children in partnership with three local schools. In addition to its Sunday activities the church also hosts various groups during the week including a Ladies Group,

a Coffee Club, monthly Friendship Lunches and provides facilities for Start-Up Stirling for its weekly food bank.

Achievements and Performance

St. Columba's Church provides spiritual and religious care to its 427 (2017 - 444) communicant members, and others living in its parish and in the wider area of the City of Stirling.

The main service of worship on a Sunday has an average attendance of 116. Monthly services also take place in a residential care home for the elderly (Annfield), where up to 30 residents may attend. During the year to 31^{st} December 2018, 3 baptisms (2017 – 2), 14 funerals (2017 – 10) and 0 weddings (2017 – 3) were conducted in the Church.

St. Columba's actively supports Start-Up Stirling, an interdenominational project of the Stirling Churches, to help the homeless by providing facilities for a weekly food bank. It also supports Woman's Aid at Christmas, Church of Scotland HIV programmes by an annual lunch and overseas work in Nepal throughout the year. Annually, the Church collects for both Christian Aid and Water Aid

Our buildings are used regularly by a local Scout Group, Stirling City Choir, Torbrex Community Choir, a Martial Arts Group and Stagecoach (theatre workshop skills). A local GP practice uses our halls and kitchen for their annual round of inoculations. The church building is part of the emergency evacuation plan for one of the homes for the elderly.

On 6th December 2018, Stirling Presbytery agreed that the congregations of Allan Park South and St Columba's should unite to form a new congregation with the present St Columba's as the principal place of worship. There will be discussions between representatives of the two congregations to agree a Basis of Union in 2019, building on the strengths and talents of both.

Financial Review

The Trustees continue to prepare accounts on the receipts and payments basis. There is no requirement in the constitution or by funders to prepare accounts.

The main source of income for the year continued to be from voluntary giving. Unrestricted voluntary donations were higher than in the previous year - £82,121 compared with £81,435 in 2017. Overall, unrestricted receipts of £124,596 were higher than the £ 120,554 figure in 2017. Voluntary donations to restricted funds totalled £34,587 in 2018, again significantly higher than the £27,996 in 2017. These encouraging increases were a reflection of the Stewardship 20/20 Vision Campaign which had been launched in June 2018.

A sum of £22,762 was recovered in 2018 from HMRC in respect of gift aid payments received in 2017. This included £17,908 in respect of unrestricted funds and £4,854 in respect of donation to restricted funds. A further £2,000 was recovered from HMRC in respect of small donations (GASDS).

Total expenditure in the year was £140,940 compared with a figure of £169,363 in 2017. The decrease was largely due to reduced expenditure on major repairs and renovation in the Church. The total expenditure included a loan repayment of £20,000 per annum to the General Trustees of the Church of Scotland. In 2018 and until final repayment in 2019, interest payments were waived. £20,000 is still outstanding but this will be fully repaid in 2019.

Overall there was an excess of receipts over expenditure of £23,992 in 2018. A surplus in the General Fund of £7,099 was transferred at the year end to the Fabric Fund, whose balance is now £53,363. The Tower and Major Renovation Fund now has a £13,168 surplus (compared with £4,836 deficit in 2017).

Reserves Policy

The Trustees' policy is to hold sufficient reserves to meet the ongoing requirements and maintenance of the church and would wish a minimum figure of £60,000. The bank account and deposit balances at 31.12.18 were £110,454 which includes £520 in the Church of Scotland Investors Trust Deposit Fund. It is proposed that in 2019, all restricted funds relating to major property renovation be consolidated in the one Restricted Fund.



Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

Charity law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which show a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and its financial activities for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operational existence.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records, which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Report of the Independent Examiner

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2018 set out on pages nine to fourteen.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The charity's Trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. The charity's Trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1)(d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under Section 44(1)(c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of the independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as Trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

Independent examiner's statement


In connection with my examination, no matter has come to my attention:
