Trustees Annual Report 2019-2020

Introduction: In March 2020, we were, like everyone in UK and beyond hit by the Covid-19 pandemic and this reshaped our work as a street pastor initiative. We thank God for the strength and grace we received and for the opportunities to share God's love in different ways during the pandemic. Our goal remains the same – to listen, help and care for anyone and everyone we come in contact with.

Patrols: Before the pandemic, until March 2020 we continued our street pastor patrols, and rail patrols. In March, we had to cancel all patrols and met on Zoom to discuss how we could continue to help our community. During lockdown [REDACTED] have participated in "telephone patrols". Over 100 people were contacted by telephone by our team, sometimes just one call, sometimes regular calls, and some resulted in doorstep visits to provide reassurance and practical help during lockdown. [REDACTED] our two new recruits were able to help with this. We also have 4 rail pastors [REDACTED] and 3 Response Pastors [REDACTED] but no patrols have taken place since March due to the lockdown, due to travel restrictions.

We have not used the base since lockdown as indoor meetings are not permitted.

During the lockdown, the sewing and knitting groups helped by making over 1700 reusable face coverings, and the street pastors helped to make these available locally. This was much appreciated by members of the public.

Street Pastors:

1. During this year, our team of 8 has been committed and have given much time and energy. At present we have 1 SP in training from Salvation Army, 5 from the Clearing, 1 from BCNC, 2 from Trinity Church, and 1 from St Margaret's Touch. (includes our new recruits). However, a number of street pastors have stepped down from activities, so our greatest need for the coming year is to recruit more street pastors.
2. A number of friends have continued to pray for us.

Churches:

1. We appreciate the support and help of the local churches, although this year it has been difficult to maintain good links with the churches. BCNC will be hosting the Commissioning of our new Street Pastors, [REDACTED] in January 2021

Training: [REDACTED] have finished their basic training, and a number of our street pastors completed online training recently. This was particularly helpful as we look at how to patrol in a post-lockdown context.

Looking ahead: We look ahead to 2021 with hope and excitement. The new year will bring new challenges and who knows what lies ahead. The Trustees and the Management have decided that it would be best for us to form a Fife-wide Initiative with Dunfermline and Kirkcaldy. This would enable us to be more effective and to be able to work together more with the other teams. It would also reduce our financial commitment to Ascension Trust. As we are a small team, this will make a big difference to our financial viability. We hope that this will go ahead quite soon, possibly by the end of January 2021. We will continue to provide help and support for the local community by providing food and basic supplies, helping with benefits, helping those who are homeless, providing activity packs and toys for

children, providing regular telephone befriending service and doorstep visits when necessary. All of our activities are Covid-19 safe and we adhere to the national guidelines on Covid restrictions.
