Edinburgh Greenside Church of Scotland Year ended 31 December 2022

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The trustees present their annual report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2022. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on pages 9 and 10 and comply with the General Assembly Regulations for Congregational Finance, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland published on 16 July 2014.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Achievements and Performance

At Greenside, our regular services are held on Sundays at 11am. Other services have traditionally included family services, united services with local congregations and the 'All Nations Advent Service' (attended by minority church groups of many nationalities). Throughout the year, the Christian Coptic Church, Russian Orthodox Church, Asian Concern and the Swedish Church have also traditionally held services and congregational events at Greenside.

Our Children's Ministry continue to hold regular services and an occasional outdoor event for local children and their families using the Godly Play programme and resources. In addition to the monthly programme, this summer the children and their families enjoyed a summer picnic outing. Greenside held charity fund raising events for Christian Aid. This year the other charities we regularly support have benefitted from the Church Benevolent Fund. These charities include Tearfund, Fresh Start, and Bethany Christian Trust as well as Poppy Scotland.

Toppings Bookshop have been holding author events in our sanctuary but unfortunately the Festival Fringe Company were unable to participate in the limited Fringe event this year. The hall accommodation is used by some 200 young members of Girl Guiding and Scouting as well as occasional use by youth theatre and musical groups.

The church website continues to be used by members of the congregation and the public. A weekly order of worship and notices are available for weekly services and a monthly newsletter was produced and widely distributed.

Achievements and Performance (continued)

Pastoral Care continues to be a fundamental feature of the life of the congregation and is undertaken by our locum Minister, Rev Susan Stark, together with our pastoral care team and members of the congregation. The significant number of elderly members of the congregation mean that pastoral care has become extremely important to these members and friends of the congregation. While regular visiting had to stop due to the pandemic a 'Phone a Friend' system was put in place. Members were linked with each other and they agreed a routine pattern of regular calls. While visits are now possible the Phone a Friend continues. Cards marking birthday and special events were sent as are regular notes to those members in Care Homes. Easter and Christmas cards were sent to every family in the congregation and the monthly newsletter has continued to be produced and issued electronically and in hard copy. Flowers and plants have been delivered to the aged and most vulnerable members.

Greenside continues to be key to the innovative Arts Outreach project. The project leader, Rev'd extended his chaplaincy work and is now chaplain to all three major city centre theatres as well as the Playhouse and the Omni Centre. In addition to his chaplaincy work which involves welcoming and supporting theatre staff and performers, he has been offering film and discussion evenings for local churches and has been working with the refugee community. In addition he was a key member of the organising team of a major show case event at the time of this year's General Assembly and in addition organised a Christmas Carol event in the Ross Bandstand in West Princes Street Gardens. The Rev'd etired on 31st December 2022 and was warmly thanked for his work, leadership and for the support he has given to Greenside Parish Church.

Financial Review

Our members' regular offerings and freewill offerings, including the gift aid reclaimed, remain a steady source of income. We are now able to resume letting our halls and the revenue from this source has been a great benefit. The rental income we receive for having a telephone mast in our tower give a further much needed source of income along with the investment income we receive from our investments. We are fortunate to have had large financial reserves as our costs have been much greater than our income over the past number of years.

Investment Policy and Performance

Our investment managers, Quilter Cheviot, have continued to achieve reasonable returns in a difficult market. They are instructed to invest ethically to provide growth and income at a medium risk. We experienced a loss on revaluation as at 31 December 2022 which is in line with general market performance.

Risk Management

The Kirk Session's general monitoring and review of the activities of the church is such that we keep under review the major risks facing the church. The Trustees have considered the major risks to which the charity is exposed and are satisfied that appropriate systems and procedures are in place to mitigate those risks.

Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of not less than one year's expenditure. At the year end the Church held unrestricted funds of £482,858 (2021: £625,796) of which £482,858 (2021: £625,771) has been designated for the purposes of Greenside Church of Scotland, as such purposes may be determined from time to time by the members of the Kirk Session and £nil (2021: £25) for the Choir Fund. Although the balance on the general fund at the end of the year is £nil (2021: £nil) the amount designated for the purposes of Greenside Church of £482,858 (2021: £625,771), above, represents several years' expenditure. With the proposed uniting with Broughton St Mary's we have taken the decision to close the Flower and Choir Fund as well as our Benevolent Fund.

The Church also formerly held restricted and endowment funds. These have now been fully utilised or, in the case of the endowment funds, with OSCR approval, have been transferred to general funds in the year. There are no restricted or endowment funds held at the end of the year.

Structure, Governance and Management

The congregation is a registered charity, number SCO09749 and is administered in accordance with the terms of the Model Deed of Constitution. It is subject to the Acts and Regulations of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

Since 1st January 2018 Greenside has operated under the terms of the unitary constitution. Certain operational responsibilities are delegated to four committees. These are Fabric, Finance, Pastoral Care and Outreach. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from members of the congregation who are considered to have appropriate gifts and skills. Three elders have resigned from the Kirk Session due to transferring to other churches. These three elders have ceased to be trustees. Greenside Parish Church is currently in Guardianship and during this period of vacancy, an Interim Moderator is appointed by the Presbytery and takes the place of the Minister. The Rev became the Interim Moderator in September 2019 and also our Locum Minister since January 2022. The Guardianship is currently extended until 30 June 2023.

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The Kirk Session meets six times a year to consider business. There are other occasional meetings as required. Meetings have been in person and occasionally virtually. The Kirk Session is responsible for spiritual and material affairs within the Church and is the responsible decision making body for the charity. Discussions are expected to begin in January 2023 with Broughton St Mary's Parish Church which would lead to a union of the two churches during 2023.

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Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Edinburgh Greenside Church of Scotland

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2022, set out on pages 7 to 15.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's Trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (a) to (c) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the 2006 Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies are set out below.

Basis of preparation

The accounts (financial statements) have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant note(s) to these accounts. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

Going Concern

The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue as a going concern.

Fund accounting

Funds are classified as either endowment funds, restricted funds or unrestricted funds, defined as follows.

Endowment funds are funds which have been given on the condition that the original capital sum is not reduced, but the income therefrom is used for the purpose defined in accordance with the objects of the charity.

Restricted funds are funds subject to specific requirements as to their use which may be declared by the donor or with their authority or created through legal processes, but still within the wider objects of the charity.

Unrestricted funds are expendable at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. If parts of the unrestricted funds are earmarked at the discretion of the trustees for a particular purpose, they are designated as a separate fund. This designation has an administrative purpose only and does not legally restrict the trustees' discretion to apply the fund.

Income

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Donated Services and facilities

Donated professional services and donated facilities are recognised as income when the charity has control over the item, any conditions associated with the donated item have been met, the receipt of economic benefit from the use by the charity of the item is probable and that economic benefit can be measured reliably. A corresponding amount is then recognised as expenditure in the period of receipt. In accordance with accounting practice the general volunteer time of congregation members is not recognised.

Interest Receivable

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the bank.

Fixed Assets

The charity has the right to occupy and use for its charitable objects certain tangible fixed assets, including the Church, halls and Church Officer's house, vested in the Church of Scotland General Trustees. No consideration is payable for the use of these assets. Expenditure incurred on the repair and maintenance of these assets is charged as expenditure in the Statement of Financial Activities in the period in which the liability arises.

All tangible fixed assets costing in excess of £1,000 having a value to the charity greater than one year, other than those acquired for specific purposes, are capitalised. Depreciation is provided on a straight-line basis to write off the cost or initial value, less residual value, of tangible fixed assets over their estimated useful lives:

Accounting policies (continued)

Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at market value at the balance sheet date. Unrealised gains and losses represent the difference between the market value at the beginning and end of the financial year or, if purchased in the year, the difference between cost and market value at the end of the year. Realised gains and losses represent the difference between the proceeds on disposal and the market value at the start of the year or cost if purchased in the year.

Taxation

Edinburgh Greenside Church of Scotland is recognised as a charity for the purposes of applicable taxation legislation and is therefore not subject to taxation on its charitable activities. The charity is not registered for VAT and expenditure therefore includes irrecoverable input VAT.

Purposes of Endowment Funds

After approval from OSCR the J Blackie and Hopkirk Endowment funds were closed in 2022, with the balances held being transferred to general funds. William Whyte Fund was closed in 2021 with approval from OSCR, and the balance distributed equally to Fresh Start, Bethany and the Trussell Trust.

Purposes of Restricted Funds

The Benevolent Fund: The Trustees have set aside funds for benevolent purposes. In 2013 the Church received a legacy from the late Barbara McAlpine which was to be applied to the Kirk Session Benevolent Fund. The remaining monies in this fund were fully utilised in 2022 and the fund is now closed.

Purposes of Designated Funds

Manse Proceeds Fund: The manse and garage were sold and the proceeds invested and designated for the purposes of Greenside Church of Scotland, as such purposes may be determined from time to time by the members of the Kirk Session and the elected members of the Congregational Board.

Flower Fund: This fund was closed in 2021.

Choir Fund: The remaining monies in this fund were transferred to the Kirk Session Benevolent fund in 2022 and the Choir fund has now been closed.
