Structure, Governance and Management Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Model Deed of Constitution of the Church of Scotland. The governing body is the Kirk Session which oversees the spiritual affairs of the church, maintains the membership roll, oversees the temporal and financial affairs of the church and oversees the care and maintenance of its buildings, furnishings, utilities and grounds.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills to oversee the spiritual affairs of the church. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery. Candidates chosen by the Kirk Session to become elders are inducted into the office of elder at special ordination services. Members of the Kirk Session are chosen for life.

Organisational Structure

Kirk Session meets regularly. The Kirk Session maintains the Communion roll of the church and carries out regular visits to check on the welfare of its members. Kirk Session meetings are moderated by the minister. A Session Clerk is appointed to keep an accurate record of the meetings, to assist in receiving incoming correspondence, and preparing outgoing correspondence for the church. The Kirk Session responds to special remits from the General Assembly and the Presbytery, plans and oversees mission and outreach activities within the parish, and oversees the stewardship and pastoral affairs of the church.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in policy. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond. The following regularly scheduled ministries and activities are carried out by the church.

Achievements and Performance

The church's ministerial and outreach activities for the parish and the surrounding community are highlighted in the following details:

The Guild met fortnightly from January - March and October - December. At the start of the session in October we were pleased to welcome some new members. There has been a variety of speakers - two being from the chosen Projects and others just run by members on discussion topics and getting to know you. At the end of the session in March it was decided that a meal out together rather than an outing was the preference and enjoyed by most of the members.

We look forward to others joining us and may we remind you that it is open to men and women.

Sunday Club

Sunday Club is for Primary to S1 children who gather for opening worship with the congregation then go to the hall for the 'All-Age Sunday School' programme learning about Jesus and the Bible through stories, crafts and fun in a safe place where the youngsters can explore their faith.

Outreach

Messy Church.

Runs bimonthly throughout the year in St. Johns building in Langlee. It can take 40 children and their parents/carers are also encouraged to stay, which they mostly do, then remain to enjoy the hot food provided followed by sweet treats. Many children are from non-churched families and it also links in well with the Girls Brigade and their families.

Different themes are covered at each Messy Church.

On Good Friday the church distributed hot cross buns in town to the passing public along with literature about the meaning of Easter and an invitation to the Easter service.

Other services, such as the Christingle service, are widely advertised to encourage non-churched people to come along.

Choir

The Choir, meeting weekly and singing in 4 part harmony, rehearsed lovely new songs for Easter and Christmas and other new-to-the- choir songs. Several introits and blessings were learned and sung regularly in church. We welcome all voices and, as always, even having 2 new men (yay!), require more men and ladies!

We have fun and chat and sing a variety of different styles of music.

We normally meet January to Easter and August to December.

Seniors Badminton

Seniors badminton has 9 members who meet each Wednesday, seeking to maintain their very high standards of play. Half-way through they trouble-shoot their games over a cup of tea/coffee and reflect on their minor lapses of concentration resulting in the occasional miss or overhit or inability to reach the shuttle-cock! Despite these short-comings they are sure they are about to prove themselves a force to be reckoned with in the future! Come and join them!

The Girls Brigade

The Girls Brigade meet on Mondays in St.Johns Hall, Langlee. Explorers and Juniors (P1-P7) learned about People who help us' through bible stories, games, crafts and lots of fun. The Brigaders (S1-S6) continued their activities around food, faith and fun together. In January everyone visited Oakwood Park for a Scottish-themed evening with tenants, sharing Scottish poems, songs and some dancing and at Easter went to Glenfield Court for an Easter 'eggstravaganza' with tenants there. In May all enjoyed a lovely day out on a train trip to North Berwick, sponsored by the Borders Community Rail Partnership, visiting the Lifeboat Centre, having a café lunch and paddling in the sea (despite the weather). September saw themes around creation and being creative, lots of fun, crafts and games. A few spaces remain in the P1-P7 sections and the Brigader section has continue to grow with 10 members attending regularly.

The Coffee Stop

Coffee Stop continues every Wednesday from 10 am till 12 in St.John's small hall. Everyone arrives and leaves at a time that suits them but all enjoy catching up with each other and it's great when we see new faces, such as some members of Langlee Residents Association, who, in November, provided afternoon tea in St. Johns hall for Langlee residents; another is planned for February.

For Advent all received a copy of 'Let Earth Receive Her King' by Alistair Begg, looking at bible verses from Genesis onwards tracing God's plan and purposes until the coming of Christ and then to his return again. As we wait for Christ's second coming, it's a joy to be involved with a group of people who show real care and love for each other.

Reserves Policy

It was agreed to hold a reserve of approximately three months' expenditure in the General Fund.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007.

They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2024, which are set out on pages 9 to 14

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

5 Minister's Stipend

For the year under review the minimum stipend was £31,642 and the maximum stipend in 5th and subsequent years of service was £38,884
