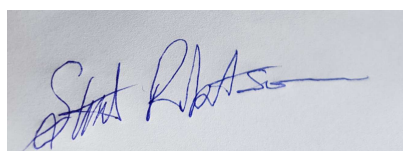

Basis of Independent examiners' statement

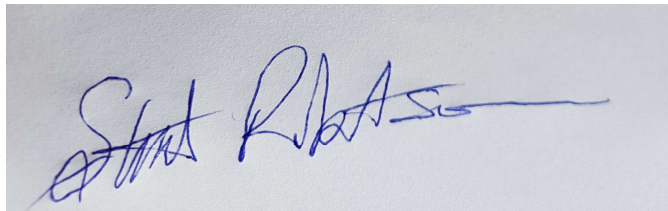
