Trustee recruitment and appointment

When recruiting Board members the company undertakes a skills audit of the current Board to ascertain any gaps in expertise. They then advertise publicly, normally via Creative Scotland's website and through social media. A Board Job Description exists for all prospective candidates. Selection then takes place with one existing Board member via an informal interview. Successful applicants are then elected onto the Board as per the company constitution. They then receive an induction pack welcoming them to the company. Board service is normally set at three years.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

21Common blend iconoclastic references, pop culture and preoccupation with risk and danger to create spectacular dance experiences. As artists they are passionate about social practice which is vital in subverting the expected dynamic of leader and what that means in the context of performance art. Their work has consistently challenged the notion of who can be a dancer and has placed those that are under-represented in that role.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

In the year 2023/24 21Common continued to deliver against its annual plan as laid out in the Creative Scotland Regular Funding Agreement.

21Common and National Theatre of Scotland presented a hugely successful sell out edition of our new show *Thank U, Next* at Bellahouston Academy in February 2024. Several representatives from Creative Scotland, Scotlish Government and funders attended which further raised the profile of the work.

We delivered two editions of Disruptive Pedagogy, our flagship education programme supported by the Paul Hamlyn Foundation at St Rose of Lima Primary School in January/February/March 2024 and at St Alberts Primary School in April/May/June 2024. This work engaged over 300 children and produced two new artworks.

21Common was included in Creative Scotland's "Hero" showreel which captures the diversity and vibrancy of Scotland's culture and creativity, developed as part of their work as a 'Brand Scotland' partner.

21Common led movement workshops at the National Theatre of Scotland Creative Insights Event for Scotlish Secondary School Drama Teachers. This involved 80 drama teachers from all across Scotland coming together for workshops and networking.

21Common were significantly highlighted by Creative Scotland at Tanzmesse (Europe's Dance Marketplace/Conference) who showcased our work Disruptive Pedagogy and Common Is As Common Does: A Memoir along with the company biography in their printed programme.


