Arbroath Courthouse Community Trust REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

Structure, governance and management

Arbroath Courthouse Community Trust is a SCIO, governed by its constitution. The day-to-day operations of the charity are delegated to the Trustees.

At each AGM, one third shall retire from office. The charity trustees to retire shall be those who have been longest in office since they were last elected or re-elected; as between persons who were last elected-re-elected on the same date, the question of which of them is to retire shall be determined by some random method.

A charity trustee who retires from office shall be eligible for re-election. There is no formal induction and training process for new trustees.

Objectives and activities

The organisation has been formed to benefit the community of Arbroath with the following objectives:

- The advancement of community development, including the advancement of urban regeneration.
- The advancement of education.
- The advancement of arts, heritage, culture, or science.
- The relief of those in need by reason of age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage.

Activities and performance

Over the past year the Trust has been particularly active in progressing the development of the Courthouse project.

We held a successful Crowdfunding campaign which exceeded the set target to increase revenue funds for the Trust. Very well supported by local businesses in providing awards to those who participated. We took part in the national OPEN DOORS programme in September with much interest being shown by those who crossed the threshold.

The Trust, under advice from our design Consultants, agreed that the best option to continue the development would be to phase the programme of adaptation of the comptex and that policy is now the preferred option.

Our joint submission with Angus Council to the Capital Regeneration Capital Grant fund 2022 was withdrawn at the last moment. Subsequent to that the Trust applied to the Place Based Improvement Fund run by Angus Council and secured funding of £281,000 towards the cost of Re-roofing both buildings. Additional support funding for this will be under the HES Repair Grant scheme aided by other submissions to cover costs.

Our consultants produced technical details and with the QS issued Tender Contract Documents for re-roofing as Stagel. After due consideration a Contactor was accepted and appointed to proceed with the work. An unavoidable delay to commencement of the work occurred and now will start in early November due to unforeseen circumstances and should last between 4/6 months.

Last summer the Trust carried out a Survey of Businesses and Retail units in the High Street and the immediate surrounding area. The results of the survey outcomes were positive and further work on creating possible partnerships with retailers and commercial business elements was one distinct aspect to be welcomed.

The Trust had made a submission in spring 2022 to the UK Community Ownership Fund this was unsuccessful, but we were advised to re-apply to the next round by improving aspects of our first submission. This second submission was guided by the Development Trust Association Scotland who offered detailed development aspects based on previous feedback from the first submission. They also provided funding to up-date our Business Plan in July this year. The Trust's submission was ably supported by Angus Council's Funding Officer as well as our Communities Officer, assistance gratefully welcomed by the Trust. The outcome for this application should be known very soon. If successful it will provide the bulk of funding for Stage2 which is to repair the external fabric of both buildings. A donation from the Town Improvement Trust was welcomed.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 January 2024 which is set out on pages 4-6.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The charity's Trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustees Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. The charity Trustees consider that the audit requirement of the Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeks explanations from the Trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.
