Objectives

Aviemore Allotment Association became a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) on 2nd March 2023.

The organisation has been formed to benefit those residing within the PH22 postcode area, with the following purposes:

To advance environmental protection or improvement by encouraging a variety of people to use the allotments for cultivation of fruit and vegetables and by helping to raise awareness of issues such as food waste, reducing food miles, increasing composting and issues surrounding the protection of the environment.

To provide recreational facilities, or the organisation of recreational activities, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the persons for whom the facilities or activities are primarily intended by providing affordable allotment spaces, opportunities for people to grow their own food and to keep physically and socially active.

Achievements and performance

Since the Trust was formed, the work of Aviemore Allotment Association has focussed on negotiating with NHS Highland on the details of our agreement for the lease of the land.

Our letter of Expression of Interest, incorporating substantial detailed information on local support for the project, has been submitted to the Asset Management Committee of NHS Highland and we are awaiting the formal outcome of their decision. It is expected to be a positive outcome and our solicitor is waiting to draw up the legal document thereafter.

Financial Review

To date the organisation have only had one grant during the financial year in question and this was a £500 grant from the Highlands and Islands Climate Action Fund.

Restricted funds

£500, was received from Highlands and Islands Climate Action Fund for the legal costs which will be incurred in drawing up the lease agreement with NHS Highland.

Trustee remunerations and expenses

No trustees were paid for time or services.

Reserve policy

The trustees hope to achieve a reserve of 3 months costs when we are up and running.
