- Hosted an annual football festival in Pitlochry with over 700 young footballers attending from all over Scotland.
- Ran coaching workshops throughout the year. Our coaches and volunteers have been provided with mentoring and development support achieving a number of Scottish FA Coach Education Qualifications.
