Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes	There were no changes to the charitable purposes and the organisation continues to promote grant funding for several local projects which showed a small increase at £14,381 total this year. Promotion of ENCOMM is continuing to become better known, partly as a result of the Fornightly Hall Community Café which has been enabled through the building refurbishment (part-funded by ENCOMM) in 2023. This brings about greater opportunities for the community to interact and steady growth is now seen to bring positive benefits to East Nairnshire and the wider locality as a result. Most of the activities funded by ENCOMM take place in or around Fornightly Hall e.g. Crafts, Nairn Book and Arts Festival and the Fornightly wildlife group.

Four Trustee meetings were held during the year, approximately one each quarter, to consider funding applications as follows. • Ongoing support for the costs of four defibrillators placed throughout the area: £2,714 • East Nairnshire Information Boards donation for repairs and materials: £209 • Fornightly Wildlife Group: £4,080 • Support for an outreach project with the Nairn Book & Arts Festival on a maritime and coastal theme: £4,879 • Fornightly Table Tennis Club for the purchase of a new table: £809
