Trustees' Annual Report

The Trustees present their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2024, along with the independent examiner's report.

Reference & Administration Details

The charity is registered as Forth Community Resource Centre Steering Group. The charity was formed in 2001 and registered with the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR): number SC031932 on 10 July 2001.

The principal office and operating address of the charity is Forth Community Resource Centre, 57 Hawkwood Terrace, Forth, ML11 8AT.

The following served as charity trustees during the year and up to the date of this report.



Structure, Governance & Management

The charity is governed by a constitution which was adopted in 2001. The charity is unincorporated.

The management committee, which normally meets on a quarterly basis, are the charity's Trustees. Membership of the management committee is open to all residents in Forth and surrounding districts and representatives of community group(s) active within the area. Trustees are elected at the Annual General Meeting.

Under the constitution, there must a minimum of seven Trustees from residents and a maximum of two additional Trustees from statutory or voluntary organisations. Elections to the management committee take place the AGM and the appointment is for one year. The office bearers are appointed at the AGM.

Objectives & Activities

Our charitable purposes are the advancement of education and the prevention and relief of poverty. The objects of the charity are to promote any charitable purposes for the benefits of the inhabitants of the village of Forth and surrounding districts, without distinction of political, religious, or other opinion.

The main activity of the charity is the running of suitable activities within the Forth Community Resource Centre.

Achievements & Performance

2023-24 was a busy year with a number of projects underway and the constant search for funding. Demand for our services remained high but threats of funding cuts persisted towards the end of the period and may impact on in work in 2024-25.

Our Integrated Care Fund grant was again extended to March 2024, by which time we had worked with 206 older people, delivering Activity Cafes to combat social Isolation and loneliness (£30,090). This extension was to allow us to make an application to the new round of funding for 2024-26. Targeting Digital Exclusion, a series of small grants were received from The Good Things Foundation to extend our work with the National Databank and National Device Bank (£10,600). This was supplemented by a grant from The Renewable Energy Fund which will be claimed in 2024-25. The Levenseat Trust (£750) and Forth Friendship Group (£500) contributed towards delivery of our Warm Welcome space, which re-launched in October, and distribution of Emergency Food and Hygiene boxes to those in need. Through a successful application to Impact Funding Partners, we were awarded grant towards delivery of Activity Cafes in 2024-26 and continued employment of our Activities Coordinator (£13986 in 2023-24). The Bank of Scotland Foundation kindly and unexpectedly awarded us funding to be used as required to continue delivery of our services in 2024/25 (£21,665). Through VASLan and The Community Mental Health and Welfare Fund we began delivery of our Getting There Project in February which will support Volunteer development, mental health and wellbeing in 2024-25 (£19,973).

With respect to sustainability, some funders have moved towards retrospective funding, where FCRCSG is required to hold reserves to fund project work and then claim monies back at intervals from grant holders. Income generated will therefore be designated against core running costs (£85,600) and future project work in 2024-2026, giving us a measure of sustainability and the means to continue supporting delivery into our community.

Financial Review

The Trustees raised a total of £118,265 in the year. The charity's total reserves as at 31 March 2024 are £241,344 of which £116,813 are Unrestricted General funds, £85,600 are Unrestricted Designated funds, and £38,931 are restricted funds. The Trustees aim to keep unrestricted reserves at a level of £50,000 which represents 12 months working capital to finance the charity and the surplus will be used by the Trustees to continue the work of the charity.

Independent Examiner's Report
