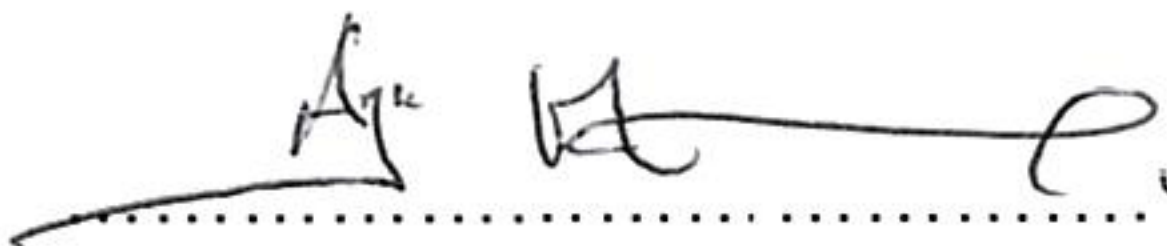

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Fife Community Sports

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31st December 2025 which are set out on page 3

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner
