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Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

This is the first full year of the Charity. The Dalgety Bay 10K was taken over from Forth Bridges Rotary as the main fundraiser for the charity and this again was a great success. It took place on the 27th April 2025 seeing almost 500+ participants run the route. This was a launch platform for the charity which increased the visibility of us within the community.

The charity spent donations on improving a section of the Fife Coastal Path with the assistance of Fife Coast and Countryside Trust (FCCT) in November 2024. The section of path was prone to flooding and needed redressing. This was completed over a few days with volunteers. There are plans to continue this work once essential water works in the area have been completed. This aids users of the coastal path to allow easy access and makes the path more wheelchair/pushchair friendly.

The Charity also gave donations to smaller groups that help with the 10K and after the 10K in 2026, will decide on where this year's funds should be distributed.

Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

Currently, reserves shall be held in the amount of previous year's 10K expenditure + 5%. ie. if 2026's expenditure was £5000, £5250 shall be held in reserve until the date of the 2027 race, at which time this amount would be reviewed. This ensures in the case of cancellation, enough funds are available for the next years event.

This will be reviewed if other re-occurring fundraising events take place that require a similar security.

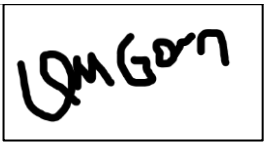
