Report of the Trustees

The Trustees are pleased to present their report together with the financial statements of the church for the year ended 31 December 2025.

Status of Charity and Governing Document

Garrabost Free Church of Scotland is established by Constitution. Garrabost Free Church of Scotland (under the original name Point Free Church of Scotland) became a registered Scottish Charity (No. SCO38120) on 26 April 2007.

Aims and Affiliation

The Free Church of Scotland currently has around 100 congregations in Scotland, as well as 2 in London and 3 in North America, and sister Churches founded by mission work in India, Peru and South Africa. The Church also has a full time degree awarding college in the heart of Edinburgh for the training of Ministers and other Christian workers and sustains an extensive Missionary programme relative to the size of the church.

Dating from 1843 but with its roots in the Reformation, it owes its distinctive title to its historical struggle to remain 'free' from state interference in its internal affairs. It has close and active relations with many other Reformed churches of Jesus Christ throughout the world and stands firmly in the tradition which accepts the Bible in its entirety as the Word of God and, therefore, derives its forms of teaching, worship, ministry and government from it. The main emphasis of our worship is the preaching of the gospel - the good news of a free and sovereign salvation through Jesus Christ alone.

The Free Church of Scotland is a Presbyterian Church adhering in its worship and doctrine to the position of the Church of Scotland at the Reformation. There is an explanatory document which explains the origins of the Church and which gives the historical background to the Church coming into being in 1843 and lists documents in which is embodied its constitution.

Garrabost Free Church of Scotland is a congregation of the national Free Church of Scotland working towards the common aims set out above. The congregation is within the Western Isles Presbytery and is authorised by the Church to have a minister paid from the central funds of the Church.

The Church building and the Minister's manse are the property of the congregation. The buildings are not under the Church's Model Trust Deed.

Trustees and Office Bearers

The Congregation is governed and administered by elected office bearers and its minister, or Interim Moderator in time of vacancy. The Kirk Session, being the minister (or Interim Moderator) and elected elders, has responsibility for spiritual oversight, while the Deacons Court, composed of Kirk Session members plus elected Deacons, oversee financial and property matters. Under charity Law, the Deacons Court are deemed to be the trustees of the congregation as those with the responsibility for day to day management and control.

Appointment of Trustees

The Kirk session exercises its discretion in determining the most appropriate method of electing new Trustees (Elders and Deacons). Any election process must involve the communicant membership of the congregation. There is no fixed term for Trusteeship. Prior to their appointment, new Trustees would have served the Church for some time in various roles and would be familiar with the Church's values, its aims and objectives as well as its day-to-day operations. As part of their induction programme, new Trustees are required to understand their statutory responsibilities of their office within the congregation as elder or deacon.

Achievements and Performance

In relation to **congregational activity**:

The congregation have had a settled ministry under Rev Iain Thomson since January 2021 until his retirement at the end of April 2026.

Our Sunday morning services are held in the Main Road building and our evening services in the School Road building. Attendance varies between 80 and 100 in the mornings and between 50 and 80 in the evenings. Both Sunday services are livestreamed and are usually watched by 20 people over and above the in-person attendance.

The midweek Prayer Meeting and Bible Study is held each Wednesday alternating between both church buildings and when the meeting is in School Road, it is also livestreamed (via congregational link only). We have an in-person Saturday evening prayer meeting each week and also have a monthly Early Morning Prayer Meeting at 8.00am via Microsoft Teams.

Sunday School meets each Sunday during the morning service during school term and is well attended with numbers ranging from 14 to 20 each week. During the summer holidays we held a Summer Sunday School which was also well attended.

We ran Christianity Explored over the winter and a women's reading and study group was also in place.

We support various organisations such as Christian Concern, the Christian Institute, Good News for Everyone (formerly the Gideons), God is Good Africa financially. Individuals support Compassion as do our Sunday School. Our Sunday School also have weekly collections to support selected organisations during the year. Individuals also support other mission agencies and we receive communication from Slavic Gospel, Dayone and others. Some of our meetings are taken by representatives of various missionary organisations and we always donate £300 for every mission organisation that interacts with us either at the prayer meeting or fellowship.

The development plan is regularly reviewed and updated by the Kirk Session.

Development Plan Summary:

Mission – Point to Christ

Vision – **'A Church with a prayerful heart for our community, where, through the preaching and teaching of the gospel, followers of Jesus are encouraged and equipped, to go and make disciples, as we long to see people of all generations commit their lives to the Lord'**

Goals – The Kirk Session have identified the following goals, and being wholly dependent on God in prayer, whilst seeking His guidance and blessing, they would desire to achieve them by March 2029

- To be characterised as a congregation who are fully dependent on God in prayer
- To be a congregation committed to the praise and worship of God
- To be recognised as a congregation that is united in vision and purpose.
- To be evangelistic in our outlook.
- To be a positive presence and influence in the district of Point.
- To be a centre of excellence for teaching, training, equipping and sending disciples.
- To have one building which enables us to deliver our vision for years to come.

In relation to **congregational funding**:

Participation in the Gift Aid Scheme remains at a high level, and congregational finances remain healthy. The congregation has responded well to meeting all its financial challenges and obligations during the past year, and remains heavily dependent on the freewill givings and the generosity of its contributors.

The Trustees are very grateful to the supporters of the congregation for their continued generosity

Financial review

Principal sources of funding

The church receives its funding from church members and adherents by way of weekly offerings and Gift Aid donations.

Results for the year

At the end of 2025 the General Fund has a balance of £40,072 (2024 - £42,287). During 2018 the Braighe Road Manse and the Aird Mission House were sold with the monies received, together with nominal values of the Garrabost Manse and Church Hall being shown in the Designated Assets Fund. The total value of the Assets Fund as at 31 December 2025 is £471,900 (2024 - £462,579). In addition various Restricted Funds are held. The total balance of Restricted Funds as at 31 December 2025 is £163,108 (2024 - £109,474). Total reserves including the net book value of fixed assets and balances on restricted funds amounted to £675,080 (2024 - £614,340).

Statement on Risk

The Trustees assess the major risks to which the charity is exposed on an ongoing basis and have established procedures to mitigate those that are identified as a result of these reviews

Report of the Independent Examiner to the Trustees for the year ended 31 December 2025

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2025 which are set out on pages 6 to 14.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (a) to (c) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

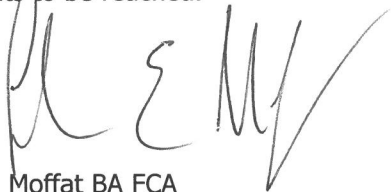

Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2025

1. Accounting Policies

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity.

The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue as a going concern. The trustees also consider that there are no significant areas of judgements, estimates or key assumptions that affect items in the accounts.

Church Income

All voluntary income and bank interest is accounted for when received. Income from tax recoveries on Gift Aid is accounted for on the accruals basis.

Tangible fixed assets

Heritable property is stated at the Trustees' estimate of market value at the balance sheet date. Upon the joining of Point Free Church and Knock Free Church the Heritable property which had been owned by Knock Free Church has now been introduced into the Garrabost Free Church Accounts with a revaluation value based upon figures in the Knock Free Church accounts for the year ended 31 December 2017. The churches have not been valued in view of the limited market available and are not included in the Balance Sheet.

With the exception of heritable property, depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:-

Manse Improvements	2% straight line
Fixtures and equipment	20% reducing balance
Computer Equipment	33% straight line

Statement of Financial Activities

For the purpose of the Statement of Financial Activities as shown on page 6, funds are defined as follows:

Unrestricted funds comprise grants and other income received for the objects of the church without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.

Designated funds represent unrestricted funds which have been earmarked by the Trustees for particular purposes.

Restricted funds comprise income which has been received for the objects of the church and specified for a restricted purpose within these objects by the donor.

Projects Fund: Represents monies received specifically to contribute towards the cost of maintenance and repair of the Church buildings.

Bayble Meeting House Fund: represents all income received from door collections at this building, together with expenditure relating to the upkeep of the property

Knock Mission House Fund: represents funds received from the sale of the Knock Mission House. They are available to organisations in the Knock, Swordale and Aignish area to apply for by means of a grant application.

Magazines and Books Fund: Represents monies received and paid for Church magazines and books.

Benevolent Fund: Represents funds held to be used for those in the community who have a special need as determined by the Trustees.

Women for Mission: Represents specific collections made for various organisations

Sabbath School Fund: Represents the weekly collections, distributed between charitable causes and the purchase of materials for the classes.

ABC Club : Represents collections received and monies expended in relation to the Childrens ABC Club

Gaelic Digitisation Project : Represents monies received and expended in relation to the Gaelic Digitisation Project

Special Collections : Represents specific collections made for various organisations

22. Knock Mission House

Knock Mission House had been transferred to the Knock community in the late 1970's or early 1980's. There are now no remaining office bearers and it has been deemed by lawyers that Title belongs to the Free Church. After consultation with the villages of Knock, Swordale and Aignish it was agreed to sell the building with any proceeds on the sale being donated to the community of Knock by means of grant application. The sale was concluded in July 2025, and yielded Net Proceeds, after legal fees, of £67,007.
