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#### Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 5 April 2024

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 5 April 2024. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

# **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### Objectives and aims

The Trust was set up to establish a Trust Fund and a collection of Objects, specimens, books, photographs and documents as set out in the Trust Deed and collecting Policy for the West highland Railway Line and to continue to house the collection in Station buildings and in the immediate environs at Glenfinnan Railway Station. The trust is responsible for the continuing maintenance and protection of the building, together with adjacent amenity land which are now leased from Spacia (Network Rail).

#### ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

#### Charitable activities

Despite attempts to keep visitor numbers at a sustainable level for the site, numbers soared to record-breaking heights.

Operation of the Dining Car tearoom was taken over by DMG Catering run by

and normal bunkhouse provision was resumed.

Visitor numbers

A total of 34,314 people (2022/23: 29,867) visited the Museum over the year. This reflects a 15% rise from 2022/23. The total accumulated visitor numbers since opening of the Museum in 1991 now stands at 395,832.

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

#### Financial position

Financial review

The Trust's wholly owned trading arm supported the Museum to the amount of £22,000. The Museum continued its Service Level Agreement with the Highland Council, under which £6,272 was received from High Life. These funds have mainly been allocated to curatorial work and conservation.

Grants received during the year include £6,033 from Museums Galleries Scotland, for Post-Pandemic environmental upgrades.

# STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

#### Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

there were no new recruitment's or appointments during the year

#### Organizational structure

continued to hold the position of the Trust's Business Manager, working an annual average of 30 hours per week. The Museum's Site Manager, continued his work on a voluntary basis throughout the year. The Museum's Curator and Secretary to the Trust, also continued to provide this work on a voluntary basis but was employed by the Trust to cover receptionist duties when required. Two part-time museum receptionists were employed on a seasonal basis.

# Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 5 April 2024

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### **Expenditure**

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Long leasehold

- at varying rates on cost

Plant and machinery

- 25% on reducing balance

Fixtures and fittings

- 25% on reducing balance

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

#### Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

The trust holds approx 1200 items in its collection of heritage assets, all relating to the construction and operation of the West Highland Railway Line from 1889 through to the present day. Insurance valuations have been used to capitalise the buildings and coaches. Heritage assets of regional and national significance are valued by independent assessor on acquisition. At present only the McAlpine nameplates fall within this category and this valuation has been used to capitalise these. The other heritage assets have not been valued as the Trustees consider that the cost of this would outweigh the benefit derived.

# 13. RELATED PARTY DISCLOSURES

Included within debtors is a balance of £19,079 (2023-£17,079) due from Glenfinnan Station Museum Limited, which is the trading subsidiary of the Trust. Gift Aid profits of trading subsidiary of £22,000 (2023 - £ £21,000) were made to the trust during the year.

Glenfinnan Station Museum Limited, which is the trading subsidiary of Glenfinnan Station Museum Trust, operates from premises occupied by the Trust. The Trust has a lease agreement with Network Rail, that specifies a £1 peppercorn rent is paid. Therefore no commercial consideration is given for the trading arm to pay the rent to the trust for using the premises to trade. No formal lease agreement is in place between Glenfinnan Museum Limited and Glenfinnan Station Museum Trust.
