OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Go Kids Performing Arts has been established to pursue the following objectives:

- 1 To provide a quality teaching and learning experience in a unique family-like environment with fully inclusivity and accessibility both in and out of school.
- 2 To nurture our young people's talents, develop key transferable communication and social skills, and to promote self-expression through encouraging them to step outside of their comfort zone in a safe and judgement free environment.
- 3 To give insight into the life of a working performer and the performing arts industry. With our classes and workshops delivered by professionally qualified working actors and musicians, regardless of the young peoples long term career goals, their experiences and skills will be honed to be invaluable in any future workplace or university/college application.
- 4 To signpost individuals and families to local support groups and networks that we work in association with and others which possibly be of help.
- 5 Based in Wishaw, North Lanarkshire GKPA caters for local youngsters but membership is not geographically restricted. The Scottish index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD) 2006 identified specific issues in the Lanarkshire area and we firmly believe a community focused performing arts club enables us to address some of the issued on our area as well as improving confidence, communication and tackling mental health problems and isolation. We believe that by incorporating life skills and a healthy attitude to physical activity in the accessible community setting, we can go some way to addressing the issues identified.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Significant Activities

GKPA have delivered performances at different community venues, including Coltness High School, Airdrie Town Hall and our own studio.

We visited local primary schools to deliver workshops, helping to engage young people in the performing arts and strengthen links within the community.

Members took part in regular “Future Friday” sessions which focused on developing confidence, teamwork and performance skills through rehearsals and creative activities.

GKPA also hosted a range of successful community events, including a musical theatre showcase involving over 200 members of the local community and allowed performers to gain feedback from industry professionals.

In addition, we provided a number of students with the opportunity to complete their NPA qualification free of charge, helping remove financial barriers to participation.

Members also raised funds for our local Neonatal Unit as the organisation’s chosen charity, supporting an important local service while encouraging young people to give back to the community.

The charity operates at present with unrestricted to be used in accordance with the charitable objectives.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Go Kids Performing Arts

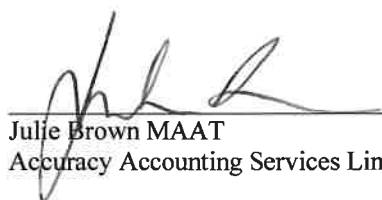
Basis of the independent examiner's report

Independent examiner's statement
