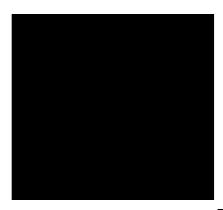

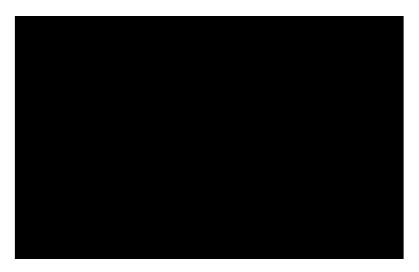
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# Objectives and activities

Trustee recruitment and appointment

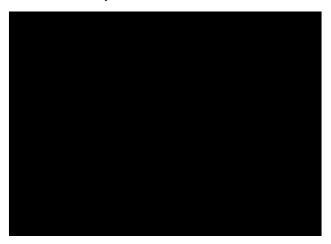
The governing document for GAF is 'CONSTITUTION of GOLDEN ANGEL FOUNDATION SCIO'

# Achievements and performance

GAF has accomplished the annual donation plan to local charities for the year. Supporting the local communities is always our goal. The donation has gone to diverse charities, schools, local community clubs, animal therapy, etc. Through the donation, GAF has indirectly helped people in various aspects.



GAF has made a real difference in the local community. We have invited a Chinese Tai Chi instructor to Ardersier to promote Taichi, which is popular and welcomed by local residents. The instructor teaches authentic Tai Chi movements, which enhance participants' wellness and well-being and allow them to experience the real Eastern culture.



Another big achievement is the sound bath event hosted by GAF, it's a meditation practice that uses gongs, Tibetan singing bowls, and crystal bowls to create a variety of unique sounds and vibrations. The sound

waves created during the sessions are supposed to rebalance the racing mind and help relax and rejuvenate the body, pulling you into a deep meditative state of being. The sound bath event received lots of positive feedback from participants.

On July 2023, GAF trustees and volunteers joined the open-day event hosted by Cantraybridge College. We provided traditional massage, animal therapy, and sound bath experience. All the income generated in the day was donated to the college.

# Financial review

As for the financial year 23/24, it is a profitable year in which a turnover of £44,349 was generated. GAF will remain the majority of the fund for saving, part of it is used for donations, to cover the operation cost. The reason for reservation for the majority of the fund is to prepare for hosting cultural exchange meetings and events in the future.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH APRIL 2024

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity. which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102. have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS I02) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### **Expenditure**

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

#### **Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

#### Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.
