# ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

#### Charitable activities

Over the past year we have focussed on the following.

" Developing a Future Route Map and Vision

The Vision is now Enabling Girvan to Be a Better Place' with Key Priorities and Objectives.

Key Priority One - Enabling Girvan to Be a Better Place.

Objectives.

1. Enabling locally based groups to reach their full potential through mentoring support and signposting to relevant agencies.

2. Supporting intergenerational and all ability groups to deliver local projects.

How did we do this?

Examples include support for the Girvan & District Men's Shed Horticultural and Woodworking Projects; Cosy Spaces support to ensure that the elderly and vulnerable are safe, warm and refreshed over the Winter months at the Girvan Town House; support to Young People's Easter and Summer activities in the Town and surrounding Villages via Z1, the Glendoune Community Association and Carrick Rugby community events; supporting intergenerational 'pop up' events at Easter, the Summer to challenge social isolation and increasing social cohesion across generations; developing a relationship with BOOST which promotes healthy eating, exercise and community activities; with local key stakeholder supported improving the accessibility of the Promenade and Beach with 'dementia friendly' benches and wheelchair accessible picnic benches; in partnerships with the Locality Planning Group of the South Ayrshire Health & Social Care Partnership and South Ayrshire Council providing more defibrillators for the Town and coordinating awareness raising and training sessions for members of the community; supporting the local not for profit Biosphere Bikes in its ambition to offer all age and all ability groups the opportunity to make the best use of their equipment including beach wheelchairs; supporting the Girvan & District Great War Project to secure Memorial Benches for the Fallen at Stair Park; Patron of the Lowland Gathering.

Key Priority Two - Strategic Partner with Statutory Bodies and key stakeholders in the Regeneration of Girvan.

Objectives.

1. To be a 'Strategic Partner' working with the Statutory Bodies and key stakeholders leading to the regeneration of the Town.

2. Be an agent of advocacy on behalf of the community to both National and Local Government and key agencies.

How did we do this?

Examples include engagement with the Create Streets/Place Planning process; liaison with the Thriving Communities & Community Wealth Building Teams; engagement with National Politicians Allan Dorans MP and Elena Whitham MSP and Scottish Government Minister, to share information on Girvan initiatives and to raise awareness of local successes and challenges; supporting the Collaborative Key Stakeholder meetings with South Ayrshire Elected Members and Officials; membership of the Scotland Town's Partnerships and DTAS and engagement with the Cross Party Group in the Scottish Parliament; and finally, cooperation with the NHS, the Council and South Ayrshire Health & Social Care Partnership to secure better health outcomes for our community through membership of the Locality Planning Group.

Additionally, to promote the regeneration of the Town of Girvan we have facilitated the establishment of a Girvan Business Association, under the Chair of

- 1. Regular community engagement both 'face to face' and on social media platforms to listen to the voice of the community.
- 2. Provide an opportunity for a 'Gathering Space' to facilitate the generation of ideas from the community.

#### How did we do this?

Examples include holding monthly meetings on the first Thursday of each month which are open to all (with the exception of January and July); optimised the use of our Facebook Page and developed a website, soon to be launched, which are proportionate to our requirements; additionally, the GTT has a representative on the following groups - the Community Council, Girvan's Story/Regeneration Initiative and the Edwardian Bandstand Committee.

" Going Forward from 2013 to 2023 - 10 Years of Service to the Town of Girvan

#### Financial Sustainability

The Girvan Town Team is a robust and sustainable Organisation. Our journey from a constituted group in 2013, to SCIO in 2016 and to award winning Community Anchor Organisation in 2020 has been one of sustained progression during at times very challenging circumstances. Financially, we have secured 3-year core funding until September 2026 from the Community Led Lottery Fund to operate the SCIO, and over the past 2/3 years have a proven track record in securing external funds for our projects from funders including the Scottish Government, Coastal Communities Fund, Windfarms, the NHS and VASA and several smaller funders. All of the funds were used to support grassroots community initiatives.

#### Membership

The current volunteer Trustees and Members have an abundance of talent and resources reflecting an eclectic mix of experience and backgrounds. In short, they are a passionate about where they live and are a very able group of individuals who are a significant community asset to Girvan and the surrounding villages. We currently have 6 Trustees with the facility within the Constitution to have 9.

#### **Professional Support**

The GTT has secured the services of a fully qualified 'Independent Certifier' who reviews our accounts and provides reports as required to OSCR to ensure our compliance with Scottish Charity Regulations. Our social platforms are also supported professionally to ensure that the information provided to the Community is up to date and relevant. Additionally, our activities are covered by a nationally recognised insurance broker.

#### National Profile

This year the GTT joined Scotland's Towns Partnership where we have access to their professional support and resources as appropriate. They have been particularly helpful in the establishment of the Girvan Business Association. Additionally, the Ayrshire Chamber of Commerce and Industry also share their expertise with the Association. This has allowed the GTT to share our story nationally.

#### And finally,

It is recognised that to cope with changing circumstances, and the ongoing day to day challenges faced by our Town and surrounding Villages, the Girvan Town Team requires to be a 'learning organisation' which is both 'flexible' and 'forward thinking'. This will stand us in good stead to ensure our optimum impact on the communities that we have served for the past 10 years and hopefully for the foreseeable future.

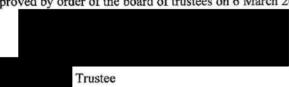

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of Girvan Town Team ('the Company')

I report to the charity trustees on my examination of the accounts of the Company for the year ended 31 May 2024.

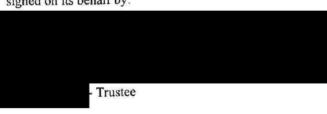

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
