

Structure, Governance & Management

Inverbrothock Playgroup is a charitable unincorporated organisation., the organisation became a registered charity on the 16th August 1984 and the purposes and administration arrangements are set out in our constitution.

The Inverbrothock Playgroup's trustees are appointed or reappointed by the members at our annual general meeting, which is held in September each year, or co-opted onto the committee at committee meetings.

All of the office bearers shall cease to hold office at the conclusion of each Annual General Meeting, but then shall be eligible for re-election.

Objectives and Activities

Our purposes, as recorded in our constitution, are to promote the aims of Early Years Scotland which are to advance the education of pre-school children with the emphasis on play experience, so that they may take a constructive place in the community and also to advance the education of their parents and other appropriate persons. As a member of Early Years Scotland, we provide accommodation, equipment, raise funds and purchase items suitable for the group.

Our vision is to continuously strive to ensure that we provide high quality childcare and learning experiences that meet the needs of all children and their families. We believe our experienced team compliment each other by working together to provide the children with nurturing, caring, and stimulating experiences. Support secure transitions, enabling all children to have confidence to build on their prior knowledge and learning.

We educate children from the age of 2 years to not yet attending primary school and provide a safe environment for them while they learn. We encourage parents/carers to support education for their children.

Achievements

Playgroup has successfully ran throughout the year at full capacity. The introduction of a waiting list has proved the playgroup is a well sought early education setting.

There were many educational activities for the children both indoor and outdoor took place. The playgroup continues to work alongside the school with consideration of the areas that they are able to facilitate including the forest and sensory garden.

In August 2023 Inverbrothock Playgroup was selected to be part of an early years accreditation pilot scheme for The Scottish Book Trust. In February 2024 we were successfully accredited and given our award at a small presentation ceremony.

Since April 2023 the playgroup developed a partnership with Arbroath Football Club which will enable us to provide opportunities for our families to support their local football team, through visits and fundraising.

This is a continuous partnership which is growing with successful links, advertising and trips.

Since December 2021 the playgroup developed links with the local church and Nursing home to spread Christmas cheer and create community participation. This is a continuous partnership which allows children and their families to build links in their community.

A good reserve of funds is being built up to ensure the suggested amount of 3 months plus of salaries is created.

There has been no remuneration to Charity Trustees during the period.

Staffing


There is currently a staff headcount of ten.

Financial Review

The results for the period are set out in the accounts. The results show a Deficit of minus £6657.02. Leaving unrestricted funds of £40,281.12 and restricted funds of nil.

Reserves

The playgroup held unrestricted funds of £40,281.12 at the year end. A reserves policy is in place to put sums away every month to prevent future low funds this system is now in working order and there are now these funds held as designated in the unrestricted sum. There is reporting at the meeting on designated fund.


Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement
