Structure, governance and management

Type of governing document

The Inveresk Village Society is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation and is governed by a Constitution. Members of the Society appoint people to serve on the Committee. The Committee controls the activities of the Society and decides on the roles within the Committee. The Committee is responsible for monitoring and controlling the financial position of the Society. The Society is not affiliated to any other body. There were no changes to the Constitution during this period.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

Trustees (Committee members) are elected by members of the Society at the Annual General Meeting. At each AGM all Trustees shall retire from Office but are eligible for re-election. Those who have served on the Committee for a period of 3 years shall automatically vacate office on expiry of that period but shall then be eligible for re-election. No external bodies are entitled to appoint Trustees.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

To advance the citizenship and community development of the village of Inveresk, by improving and maintaining the amenity thereof, and promoting activities and events for the benefit of the residents/citizens of Inveresk

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

For Christmas 2023, the Society supported a village-wide event where residents and guests sang carols around a tree, had refreshments, held a cake raffle and had entertainment for the younger ones.

An artistic resident created an image relevant to the locality which was made into wooden baubles by the Society and sold to raise funds which were then dispersed to charity.

In the Summer of 2024, the Society supported an Open Gardens event which raised money for three charities.

Many members of the Society supported a local initiative to remove giant hogweed from the area.

As a group we also continue to have strong links with CAPP, Musselburgh & Inveresk Community Council, and Neighbourhood Watch Scheme. We also supported a Community Speed Watch programme by supporting the purchase of kit, and several residents of the village are involved in the initiative to increase safety in the area by reducing speeding through the village.

A newsletter was distributed to all houses in Inveresk in December 2023 and in May 2024.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

- 1. The Society supported a successful Christmas event in December 2023 involving residents and guests of all ages, raising funds which were donated to charity.
- 2. The Society supported three local events; Giant Hogweed Eradication, Open Gardens Scheme and Community Speed Watch.
- 3. Two editions of the Newsletter were distributed to all village residents (members and non-members) during the period of this report.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Inveresk Village Society SCIO

I report on the accounts of the SCIO for the year ended 31 July 2024.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10 (1) (d) of the 2006 Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44 (1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the 2006 Accounts Regulations. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.
