All this is aimed at bringing people together for social interaction and inclusion, increasing motivation and self-esteem.

## Achievements and performance

### Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Our membership has again increased this year together with an output of better quality projects that we can sell or commissions we've undertaken has benefitted our funds and helped to keep us sustainable.

We now encourage the whole of the membership to work on their own projects and help them by giving assistance as opposed to teaching or mentoring.

We have continued to work collaboratively within our local community including:

- participating in the local Rotary's Santa Grotto.
- entering a Jed Shed tree into the Jedburgh Xmas Tree Festival and were awarded third best prize out of 25 in the public vote (proceeds from the festival go back into community projects).
- raising £300 from the sale of Christmas tree Memory Stars (hung on the town's Christmas tree in the market square) with the money going towards next year's town light displays.
- In the spring, we were involved with repainting & cleaning all the Jedburgh high street box planters.
- supporting the town's bookshop's 'Making Homes for Nature' event with 15 bird houses & 15 bug hotels.
- Providing the local Royal Voluntary Services dementia group with 10 memory box frames for dementia patients in Jedburgh.

We have had a bumper year for planter commissions and have sold planters to numerous Jedburgh shops.

Our website continues to be updated with recent projects and provides a key communication tool folk offering tool donations & project requests.

We acknowledge the support of Jedburgh Community Trust, who continue to provide us with very affordable premises for rent.




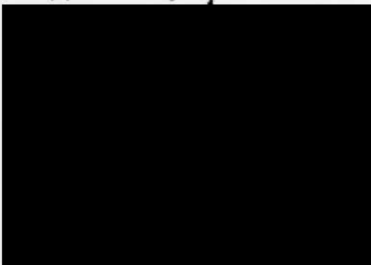
