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# REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH NOVEMBER 2024

The trustees are pleased to present their report and financial statements for the year ended 30 November 2024.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the financial statements and comply with the charity's constitution, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)" (effective 1 January 2019).

### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

### Objectives and aims

The charity is a church established for charitable purposes only, and in particular the objectives are:

To advance the Christian religion for public benefit in the United Kingdom and worldwide through:

- The organisation and provision of Christian worship;
- The provision of such facilities and services as are appropriate for the church, to enable it to fulfil its mission to the members of the Church, visitors to the Church, the local community and the wider community.
- The provision of facilities for Christian training and service;
- The support and provision of Christian evangelism and outreach;
- The provision of assistance to the wider Christian church and its ministries.

# REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH NOVEMBER 2024

#### ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

I am delighted to write this report as a reflection of what was another year in the development and life of Kirkcaldy Vineyard Church (KVC). Whilst we were presented with challenges across the year, God has been faithful to us. Below are some of its key achievements and undertakings:

- Kirkcaldy Vineyard Church is committed to the Biblical understanding of the Kingdom of God in words and in action. We have a vision to see a community of believers worship Jesus and function as a home for the presence of God. We aim to be a community who are filled-up with the Holy Spirit and long to see Jesus rise up from the heart of Kirkcaldy and West Fife.
- KVC is blessed with dedicated leaders throughout the church including our founding and current pastor, Jim McManus. We have also been blessed with the addition of a new trustee, Aileen Warnock. We also would like to formally acknowledge and thank Dave Smith of Rayleigh Vineyard Church for his valuable leadership and service during his time as a trustee.
- We currently have a core group of approximately 25 people who gather regularly in Kirkcaldy and surrounding areas. It has been encouraging to welcome new people with a desire to worship and serve together.
- The financial position of KVC in 2023/2024 has been sensitive due to an ongoing deficit and delays in recovering backdated Gift Aid returns. However, this funding was received in early 2025 and, with increased giving, has led to a stronger position with surplus funds available to cover at least 3 months of expenditure.

The church continues to support its members in the outreach work they all participate in. Some to be highlighted are:

- 1. The Growbaby ministry. This continues to bless approx 350 families per year, with many originating from the most marginalised communities in the area. Linked to Growbaby at East Wemyss is the Mum and Me" group which has regularly witnessed increased attendees. After a period of inactivity, the church has also seen the recommencement of KVC Kids Church on the first Sunday of the month.
- 2. On the last Sunday of each month, KVC supports the community lunches at 'Hosting Hope Fife' and the worship meeting of \*Rephidim\* in Leven.
- 3. Also weekly at Leven is the 'Men's Chat Group' which is well attended. Furthermore, in 2024 the monthly Men's Breakfast' commenced.

It has been an exciting year seeing God move across all areas of the church. He has supported and sustained us in 23/24 and we are excited to see how God, through KVC, will continue to minister to the people of Kirkcaldy and surrounding areas in 24/25.

### FINANCIAL REVIEW

### PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

As we look forward into the next financial year we continue to build financial resilience with developing a reserved fund. We also continue to look at areas to reduce cost whilst supporting the ministries.

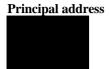
The charity is a Scottish Charitable Incorporation Organisation and is governed by its constitution.

### Independent examiner's report to the trustees of Kirkcaldy Vineyard Church

I report on the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 November 2024, which are set out on pages 6 to 14

### Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees, who are also the directors of Kirkcaldy Vineyard Church for the purposes of company law, are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investments (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. ### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH NOVEMBER 2024

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### **Basis of preparing the financial statements**

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

### **Expenditure**

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

#### **Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

### 2. TRUSTEES' REMUNERATION AND BENEFITS

There were trustees' remuneration totalling £7,200 for the year ended 30th November 2024.
