

# Chairman's Report – for the year ending 31 May 2024

### **Our Purpose**

- Furthermore, the health and well-being of our children is the club's paramount consideration.

#### **Our Objectives**

- To provide a structured and safe environment for children and young people to learn and develop football skills.
- Promote personal, professional, and social well-being through football experiences, regardless of an individual's socioeconomic status, age, gender, race ethnicity, national origin, religion, disability, or sexual orientation.
- To make football more accessible to girls and boys.
- To help children and young people learn skills and values for later life.
- To support our local community by taking part in events and making use of the resources and skills that we have available.

#### **Priorities for 2024**

- 1. Resolve the legacy challenges
- 2. Secure the financial viability and future of the club
- 3. Grow the number of players and coaches
- 4. Create a sense of the pride in the club
- 5. Have good governance and controls in place

These priorities created a Club Improvement Plan prepared in April 2024, which is being updated for 2025.

- Club has secured significant funding for projects
- Subscriptions are consistent and payments regular
- Regular income from solar panels
- Gift Aid has been registered
- Cash management is effective and bills paid on time
- Successful taster sessions for new players
- New U18 team established
- Weekly pitch plan operating effectively
- Pavilion open every weekend
- New coaches have joined the club
- Leadership of the club has been simplified
- Winter training plan is in place
- Better social media awareness
- Successful Cash 4 Kids fundraising
- Funding has been secured for new equipment
- Supported Lauder local initiatives

#### **CHALLENGES**

- We lost some teams and created gaps in the pathways
- Training pitch upgrade did not meet expectations
- Still some legacy property challenges (electricity, pumps)
- We need more people interested in coaching and helping
- Reliance on a small number of people for leadership
- We need more players in some groups
- There is no consistency in the team coaching approach
- Funding opportunities are harder to fid

#### **Financial Highlights**

During the financial period of this report, the accounts have been managed effectively and maintained in credit.

- Total receipts for the year were £30,391 and payments of £23,220.
- Membership subscriptions accounted for £12,295 collected through the monthly 'My Club Hub' system.
- Notable receipts included income from Grants of £9,994, sponsorship of £3,438 and backdated solar panel income of £3,431.
- Pitch hire was the largest payment from the club at £5,532 with utilities at £3,938.
- The Bank account is with Bank of Scotland with Border Accounting Services appointed as our accountants.

The Chairman is proposing these priorities for the new year.
