As always we start the year off with our May play which this year was Good Things produced by Carolyn Doig, set in a charity shop although very sad at times the humour was evident and lifted the whole play. All the cast were excellent in their own rolls, we are so lucky to have such talent.

Our September plays, Green Forms and A visit from Miss Prothero, these were two short plays produced by Dave Ross – these two plays are connected and one of the cast plays in both.

First of all set in an office environment, Doris and Doreen run the office in their own way and manage to flirt with one of the bosses. Moving on to the second play the office is now closed and Miss Prothero goes to visit one of the retired bosses who is not coping well with retirement.

Last years Panto Treasure Island was a great success and we were hoping that this years one, A Christmas Carol produced by Jo Fitzgerald would bring audiences back wanting more and it certainly did, the whole cast were fantastic from backstage, wardrobe, sound and lighting and of course the cast itself brought the whole production to a very successful run up to Christmas.

Our Youth Play this year was A Christmas Carol – The Panto, this production saw our youth group really shine, consisting of new members and members who have been with our club a few years now, the more experienced ones helping the younger ones all the time and encouraging them. The play was very funny and enjoyed by a sold out audience. For the first time we brought in an adjudicator just to let the youth see how an adult play would be critiqued, although this was a very gentle, the youth were very interested and had a lot of questions to ask.
