Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Membership

There are 41 currently paid-up members. The Trustees urge members to find and solicit other Pringles to join the CPA and current members to renew their annual membership fees. The funds are used to help fund our missions. Membership is £15 and \$20 per annum per household.

Management

The Board of Trustees are responsible for the strategic direction and governance of the Association. The Trustees have delegated routine management to the Executive Committee.

Achievements

The Clan Pringle Association and the Board of Trustees were established, a mission statement was produced and Scottish charity status was obtained.

A Clan Pringle Association North American Chapter has been established and is active and represented on the Clan Pringle Association Board of Trustees in Scotland.

An authoritative website had been established which contains a great deal of information about the family, its genealogy heraldry, branches, history, publications et alia.

The foundations of Torwoodlee Tower have been stabilised and the tower is no longer in danger of collapsing.

The Pringle Y-DNA Surname project hosted by FamilyTreeDNA was established in 2009 and continues, now with 130 persons tested.

Pringle Gathering – June 2026

The Clan Gathering held in June 2026 was a significant success, with strong attendance and very positive feedback from participants. It provided an important opportunity to strengthen connections across the wider Pringle family, both in Scotland and internationally, and demonstrated the continued relevance and value of the Association's activities.

Charitable Trustees and Association Representatives

During the year, we identified a need to clarify the distinction between *charitable trustees* and *association representatives*. Charitable trustees are those with formal responsibility for governance, compliance, and control over the charity's funds, as required by OSCR. In contrast, association representatives (referred to as "committee members") support the wider aims of the Association through regional representation, communications, and events, but do not have direct responsibility for financial or governance decisions. This distinction helps ensure clarity of roles and supports compliance with regulatory expectations.
