### Achievements and performance

#### Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

It has been a busy Year for the Society and in particular the Museum. It started off with a large donation of carved and turned woodwork donated to the Museum by the family of Mr Bill Broadhurst which was exhibited.

The Museum Guides set of procedures were updated and copies issued to all guides.

The Society Management Committee agreed that the Museum should apply for Museum Accreditation via Museums Scotland and all the necessary forms have been submitted to them.

It was further agreed that the Society should accept a Glasgow University student placement.

A designated glass showcase was allocated to local organisation to display their artifacts and provide information relating to their organisation. The first organisation was the local amateur football team Stewarton Annick, followed by the Girl Guides movement.

The Museum held two separate school outing days, the first being an exhibition and talk to remember VE day and a second in November to remember Armistice day. Both events were well attended by local schools.

The Museum artifacts and books continue to grow with the inventory No.1 containing 1000 items and inventory No.2 now over 1200 items. The museum has extracted from the main inventories all books and recorded them in a separate inventory to make book location simpler.

### Financial review

#### Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

As we became more settled within the Stewarton Area Centre location of the Museum, additional items to allow displays were now more limited. With the more settled position it was decided that some of our finance would be transferred to a Savings Account which would gain a little monthly addition while it remained in that position.

The more settled position this time left us with a positive financial position this time.
