3. Executive Summary

Paisley Community Trust (PCT) is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation - registered in Scotland [SCIO: SC045235]

4. Structure, Governance and Management

4.1 Constitution

The Charity is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (a SCIO). It was registered in its current legal form on 17th November 2014.

7.1 The charitable purposes of the SCIO are:

7.1.1 The advancement of community development and participation of the Community in regeneration of Paisley Town Centre,

7.1.2 The advancement of community development through provision of and participation in a community-led venue for cinema, arts and theatre in Paisley,

7.1.3 The advancement of the arts and culture through providing entertainment for the public and providing an environment for local talent to flourish,

7.1.4 The advancement of education for the public in the arts and performance as well as key skills which will improve employability through training, volunteering and employment opportunities; and

7.1.5 The promotion of such other similar charitable purposes.

7.2 The charitable purposes for which the SCIO is established and the subsequent outcomes are principally to benefit the Community of Paisley comprising the postcodes PA1, PA2 and PA3 ("the Community"), in addition to which it is desirable and expected that there will be public benefit in Renfrewshire, more widely and beyond.

5. Activities - Achievements and Performance

5.1 <u>A new Community Cinema for Paisley Town Centre – "PXLS":</u>

Our flagship project is for the creation of a Digital Community Hub, Digital Skills Academy and Digital Screening Rooms / Cinema called 'PXLS'.

PXLS is about reconnecting socially isolated individuals, providing support to families with children with special needs, skilling up our young people for employment, delivering much needed footfall for traders in the town, and providing leisure led entertainment that meets the Low Carbon requirements of the '20-minute neighbourhood.'

A High Street location was identified as the preferred location are (Bargain buys – the old Littlewoods store).

5.2 Levelling Up

Funding of £15,600 was awarded by Renfrewshire Council (formally on 3rd June 2021) to submit an application to the UK Government's Levelling Up Fund for capital funding in relation to the PXLS project. Deadline for applications was 12pm on 18th June 2021.

PCT appointed Lambert Smith Hampton (LSH) to complete this work to the value of the grant award. A full and robust application with associated reference and supporting materials was completed by LSH in consultation with PCT. The project was supported by our MP **Constitution** as is a requirement of the fund.

Unfortunately, the Council refused to submit the application to the UK government for scrutiny and the PXLS project and PCT had to stall and reflect on what to do next.

5.3 Chat Show

During the period of COVID 19 lockdown, PCT engaged with the local community through online media – a weekly chat show – hosted by from the comfort of their house or hut!

The chat show included guest appearances, interviews and live entertainment from a wide and varied background to tell their story, entertain and inform in a relaxed, friendly and light hearted format.
