The Trustees have pleasure in presenting their report and the financial statements for the charity for the year ended 31 December 2023. The Trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

Our purpose, as recorded in the constitution, is to promote the Christian Faith and its values amongst the church members and the community at large, throughout Scotland.

This is achieved by ministering to the spiritual needs of all members of the church and the society at large through our weekly meetings and conducting programs to empower individuals for poverty reduction and prevention, as well as assisting the elderly.

The trustees have considered the Charity Commision's guidance on public benefit, including the guidance 'public benefit: running a charity (PB2)'.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

REVIEW AND HIGHLIGHT OF ACTIVITIES

In 2023, the charity stepped up momentum in community-based activities and various events. It was a steady but progressive move to continue face-to-face activities as much as possible. Our Sunday services are fully in-person now as more of our members felt it provided a great atmosphere of fellowship and camaraderie when we all gather together corporately under one roof.

However, some of our activities have remained online, and we have adopted a hybrid model for some activities, especially subgroup meetings. We were also able to continue our outreach visits to the Almond View Care Home once every month, and we are encouraged by the testimonials of residents and their family members who see our monthly visits as something they look forward to.

We have continued to use every opportunity available to further encourage members of the charity to continue to take good care of themselves while we ensured that we did not relent in our spiritual activities and outreach to the community by way of prayers for those who need it and visitations where possible.

One of the very impactful events we had during the year was the Integration Awareness' sessions we created for all those who were new to the country. It provided an avenue to give them support in their settling down phase and to enlighten them about how to integrate into Scottish society regarding the banking system, education system, parenting, tax system, etc. The sessions were well received, and attendees confirmed the huge benefits they got from each session. Our Helping Hands' project through the Welfare team continued to thrive and provide support for vulnerable families in our community through utility bill support, provision of food parcels, various counselling sessions and visitations.

Plans for 2024

As we move into 2024, our aim will be to build upon the progress made in 2023 with face-to-face events and interactions. In particular, we will be reviewing some of the activities and meetings that are currently held virtually to see if moving them to in-person events will be worthwhile and beneficial for our members.

We shall continue to consider more creative and impactful ways of reaching out to the community and our members, particularly through our different avenues of providing welfare support.

We intend to foster and actively enhance our involvement and collaboration with other church groups and charities to organise and implement various coordinated efforts for beneficial activities and social action initiatives targeted at promoting unity, alleviating poverty and advancing the cause of the gospel.

We are also seeking to identify more opportunities and innovative ways to carry out charitable activities that will be of great benefit to the community. We are in talks with established social enterprise groups, particularly within the ethnic minority demography, that have indicated interest in organising Workshops and seminars where our members will be taught entrepreneurship skills and made aware of the support that is available out there for those who want to start their own business or social enterprise.

No matter the challenges that may come our way as we go into this new year, our resolve remains to be more committed and diligent in seeing the fulfilment of our mission and vision. We shall not relent in our prayers as we strive to witness many more positive changes in our immediate community and in the lives of the people we minister to.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The Charity received income of £96,714 (2022: £68,744) during the year, with a deficit of -£22,928 (2022: surplus £4,120). Income for the year increased by 41%%, The major expenses were Building Maintenance cost £48,368, Missions & Outreach £16,584 and Muilti Media £13,669

Reserves

Funds held by Fountain of Love Glasgow are unrestricted/general funds or restricted funds. Unrestricted general funds are funds that can be used in accordance with the charitable objects, at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds are funds that are used for purposes as stipulated by the donor.

Reserves Policy

It is the charity's policy to maintain reserves at a level sufficient to meet planned expenditure requirements for the next three months. Reserves will continue to accumulate and reflect the capital value of the assets held.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The Charity is controlled by its governing document, The constitution, that constitutes an unincorporated charity.

Recruitment and appointment of trustees

Trustees are selected from Christians of any denomination and are appointed by the agreement of existing trustees.

Induction and training of new trustees

The Trustees have confidence in the experience and ability of the trustees to administer the activities of the charity. Induction and training will be considered on an ongoing basis, particularly in the event of a new Trustee being appointed.
