- (c) Carrying out Baptism, Marriage, Funerals, Child dedication services.
- (d) Publication of literature: Leaflets, booklets and other printed materials shall be produced to inform and communicate the essence of the Christian doctrine.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Some highlights of the Year 2025 include the following:

- We maintained having virtual and in-person church services.
- We maintained the regular two midweek online services and one Sunday service throughout the year. There was good interaction and good participation during Sunday School classes. Generally, these gave week-long opportunities for brethren to be re-inspired, supported and encouraged.
- The Prayer department of the church charity had weekly prayer meetings. The Prayer department also organised a prayer retreat on 15th February 2025 for the church workforce; guest ministers were invited to lead various sessions.
- Collaborations:
- We participated in church planting activities culminating in the opening of a new RCCG parish at Northfield, Aberdeen on 9th February 2025.
- On Friday 4th July 2025 we collaborated with Catalyst Vineyard Church for the wedding ceremony of one of our church members.
- We were at Fraserburgh on 6th September to collaborate with the RCCG parish there for outdoor ministrations – evangelism, prayer walking and song ministrations.
- We combined with Inverurie District churches Together (IDCT) in the various major annual services and activities like joint Passion week services, joint Good Friday walk, joint Ascension and Pentecost Services, and joint Christmas Carol service.
- Brethren were also encouraged to attend online Sunday house fellowships as started by Fountain of Love Inverurie but currently administered by Fountain of Love Aberdeen.
- Every Church Charity activity both online and in-person was always open to members of the public to attend. We held two outdoor Sunday worship services at Easter and on 14th September 2025.
- Maintained attendance / engagement at Children and Teen Classes.
- We had 21st March parents' outing for bonding and team building.

Achievements and performance

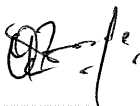
- We had successful Children & Teens Day out in August 2025 plus a three-day vocational program in sewing for teens.
- We thank God for testimonies including safe journeys, healings, new jobs and academic progresses.
- The Men's Fellowship held their monthly Prayer fellowship throughout the year during which they prayed extensively for world events – praying the news - and for the brethren.
- The Good women's fellowship is still buoyant to the glory of God.
- There was hospitality provision for every meeting – Sunday services, celebration cake for those born in each month, Glorious Tempo, Christmas events, easter celebration, Fathers' Day celebration and Mothers' Day celebration.
- We had spring cleaning plus periodic internal and external cleaning of the church premises; mowed the lawn regularly.
- On Saturday 12th July 2025, we had Summer Barbeque for the community and for the brethren.
- On Friday August 1st, 2025, we had Glorious Tempo – an evangelistic musical outreach programme at Inverurie town hall located at the centre of Inverurie town. The theme was 'He's Got You'. Mandy Sangbarani, Great Aji Dawuda and Dcn. Sola Okunuga ministered along with RCCG Fountain of Love, Inverurie choir to the glory of God; a number of people accepted Jesus and some re-dedicated their lives to Jesus Christ as well.
- Children and Youth church continued to the glory of God.
- Mercy Outreach:
- Weekly services at Homes for the Elderly (The Grove, Kemnay and Garioch Home for the Elderly, Inverurie) were held at the two Homes
- During 2025 Easter and Christmas, we held special services (14th and 21st December Carol Services during Christmas period) when we prayed, sang and gave out gifts to the residents there.
- We distributed Christmas hampers to homes of less privileged people in the community, Christmas gifts which were useful all year round to homes for the elderly that we visit and responded to needs of people who called us requesting emergency food supplies.

Overall, we give glory to Jesus Christ who has helped us to achieve these, praise God. Thank you.
