 (d) Publication of literature: Leaflets, booklets and other printed materials shall be produced to inform and communicate the essence of the Christian doctrine.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period	As we bring 2025 to a close, we lift our hearts once again in gratitude to the God who has sustained, strengthened, and expanded us. This year has been marked by fresh encounters, deeper discipleship, and a widening footprint of love across Portlethen. Through every service, outreach, training session, and celebration, His faithfulness has remained our anchor, and His grace has continued to bind us together as one family. Our children's ministry blossomed with joy and creativity throughout the year. The Fun Factory in March brought colour and excitement to our Junior Church, beautifully themed around Mothers & Others. Monthly Movie Sundays created space for fellowship and imagination, while the Easter Egg Hunt in April filled the church with laughter and community warmth. May's Children's Weekend reminded us again of the treasure God has placed in our care, and the growing participation of our children in Adult Church strengthened our intergenerational worship life. Their enthusiasm, innocence, and spiritual curiosity continue to inspire the entire congregation. Revive Church, our teenage ministry, experienced remarkable growth and maturity. One of our teens gained admission into university, continuing our testimony of academic progress and divine favour. The establishment of the Revive Choir became a defining moment, with teens ministering on selected Sundays and enriching the worship atmosphere whenever they served. The Summer Hangout, themed Rolling With Jesus, provided a refreshing time of bonding and spiritual reflection. Youth Camp offered deeper encounters and discipleship moments, while the seven-week youth training programme equipped our teens with biblical foundations and practical life skills. Their active integration into Adult Church—serving in media, worship, and operations—has strengthened the unity and vibrancy of our church family. Across the adult church, 2025 was a tapestry of worship, prayer, learning, and community engagement. The Women's Seminar in February brought encouragement and empowerment to our women. The six-week media course that ran from February to March sharpened technical excellence and expanded our digital ministry capacity. March's Special Praise Day filled the sanctuary with thanksgiving, while June's three-day prayer and fasting season drew us into deeper consecration. August's Time to Flourish Prayer Retreat refreshed the body and reignited spiritual fire, and September's Outpouring Concert became a prophetic moment of worship and revival for many in attendance. Weekly leadership training continued to strengthen those who serve, ensuring that ministry is carried out with competence and spiritual depth. Our commitment to the Portlethen community remained visible and heartfelt. We continued to engage with the Community Larder, offering practical support to families. Participation in the Portlethen Gala strengthened our local presence, while our visit to Lethen Park Care Home brought comfort and companionship to residents. Evangelism remained a core expression of our identity, often combined with street cleaning as a reflection of our love for both people and place. Our involvement with the District Council, Gala activities, and the outdoor flower group further deepened our integration into the life of the community.

Yet, as in previous years, the absence of a permanent building remained a significant challenge. The weekly cycle of packing, transporting, and setting up equipment continued to stretch our volunteers and resources. This burden has become more than an operational inconvenience; it is a spiritual and strategic necessity that we continue to present before the Lord. Throughout the year, our collective prayer has remained steadfast: "Lord, please release the key to this building to Your Church." We trust that the God who has sustained us will also establish us.

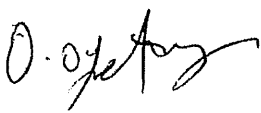
