Structure governance and management

Type of governing document	The Redeemed Christian Church of God - Zoe Parish Paisley is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO). Its purposes and administration arrangements are set out in its constitution.
Trustee recruitment and appointment	The trustees are appointed by the Church Congregation to act in the interests of the Charity. They serve for a minimum of one year, after which they may be reappointed or removed and replaced by others. The trustees provide oversight of the spiritual, financial, property and administrative affairs of the Charity and ensure that its resources are used to advance its charitable purposes.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes	The purpose of the Charity is to advance the Christian religion amongst its membership, the community and the world at large, in order to glorify God and manifest His character.
Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects	During the year, our main activities comprised organising Sunday worship services, Bible study meetings, prayer meetings and other Christian programmes to promote the Christian faith. We continued to provide pastoral care, counselling, prayer and practical support to members of the congregation and people within the local community. The Charity also maintained activities for children, young people, families and adults, and used its premises to create a welcoming place of worship, fellowship, support and belonging. Through these activities, we promoted unity, harmony and peace within the local community by teaching and demonstrating the virtues of the Christian way of life as embodied in the person and character of Jesus Christ.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the Charity during the financial period	The year was one of consolidation and continued growth for the Charity. Having acquired our property at 7 Causeyside Street in January 2024, we completed our first full financial year operating from the premises. The building enabled us to sustain regular worship, prayer, teaching, children's and youth activities, pastoral care and practical support for people within the congregation and the wider community. We continued to strengthen the Greenock parish, which was planted from Zoe Parish Paisley in April 2023. The growth of the work increased the need for pastoral support, volunteer coordination and closer oversight from the mother church in Paisley. A significant achievement during the year was the preparation and launch of a new parish in Renfrew. Following a period of prayer, outreach and planning, RCCG Zoe Parish Renfrew commenced on 18 January 2026. This extended the Charity's Christian ministry and community presence into another part of Renfrewshire. The Charity continued the phased improvement and maintenance of its Paisley property so that it could better support worship and community use. Particular attention was given to the condition, functionality and long-term suitability of the premises, including planning for improvements to the toilets, kitchen, roof, windows and energy performance. Throughout the year, the Charity continued to support individuals and families through pastoral contact, prayer, counselling, hospitality and practical assistance. These achievements were made possible by the faithful giving of members and the substantial contribution of our volunteers.
