Royal British Legion Scotland (Fort Augustus branch) is an unincorporated body registered as an individual charity (date of registration 31 May 2011). Governance and management is carried out by appointed trustees in accordance with the terms of the branch constitution.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

The trustees, who also act as the management committee, normally meet on a monthly basis. Trustees are elected at the Annual General Meeting which is usually held during January. Recruitment of new trustees is also encouraged throughout the year among members of the local community with an interest in the objectives of RBLs.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

The prevention or relief of poverty amongst men and women who have at any time honourably served with any branch of the naval, military and air forces of the Crown (whether Regular or Reserve); Royal Observer Corps and members of HM Coastguard; the Merchant Navy; the Forces of Allied Nations; the Women's Land Army; the Women's Timber Corps; Bevin Boys; members of the War Widows Association or Adult Cadet Instructors and their spouses, partners and dependants, referred to as "ex-Service men and women"

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

The encouragement of ex-service men and women in the local area to participate in branch activities and to make active use of the facilities available at RBL Scotland Fort Augustus club premises for the purpose of social interaction and enjoyment. Arrangement of Remembrance Sunday parade and other events within the Fort Augustus village area to commemorate and remember all those who have served.
