Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Branch Trustees have continued their hard work to further the interests of Legion Scotland and promote this through working within the local community.

Net assets of the charity are the branch premises at Canalside, Fort Augustus and the Trustees are satisfied that the premises have been kept and maintained in a good state of repair.
