Trustees Annual Report 2021

Charitable purposes

- (a) To advance all forms of the Arts in Scotland and elsewhere in the United Kingdom.
- (b) To improve the accessibility of all forms of the arts to the general public.
- (c) To advance the educational aspects of the Arts.
- (d) To encourage and assist in the development of up-and-coming artists, exhibitors, composers, architects, designers, writers, producers, performers, and others in all forms of the Art.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

The pandemic placed major limitations on performance opportunities. In 2021, new work by vas recorded at the Scottish Arts Club and promoted through all Trust social media platforms. Recording also began on works by

The Trust again ran an international short story and a flash fiction competition. The Isobel Lodge short story award was given to an unpublished writer born, living or studying in Scotland. A third Anthology, A Meal for the Man in Tails, featuring a selection of top writers from the Short Story and Flash Fiction awards was published.

The Trust ran the Scottish Portrait Awards (SPA) in Fine Art and Photography for a fifth year. Sixty finalists were exhibited for a month in Edinburgh. This exhibition was then transferred to Gracefield Arts Centre Dumfries in early 2022 before travelling to Glasgow Art Club.

Substantial preparations for the first Scottish Landscape Awards exhibition in the City Art Centre in 2023 were undertaken.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

The Short Story and Flash Fiction competitions, both open to writers worldwide, attracted over 1000 entries.

Cash prizes of £1000, £500 and £250 were awarded to 1st,2nd and 3rd short story winners respectively. Flash Fiction winners were awarded £600, £300 and £150. A prize of £600 was given for the Short Story Isobel Lodge Award for an unpublished Scottish writer. The Golden Hare Award of £300 was given for Flash Fiction for an entrant living or studying in Scotland. The awards were made in person in 2021. YouTube and the Trust website promoted these writers and their stories to a greater audience.

The Scottish Portrait Award and Photography Awards entries were lower in 2021 than in the previous year. Prizes of £5000, £1000 and £500 were awarded to 1st,2nd and 3rd Fine Art winners. Photography winners were awarded £3000 1st, £500 2nd and £150 3rd. In addition, £500 prizes were awarded to two SPA Young Fine Artists and one Young Photographer, a competition for entrants aged 16 to 25 years. 60 exhibiting artists were all promoted in the SPA catalogue. In addition, each of the 94 long listed fine art works and each of the 84 photographic works were featured in individual social media promotions.

The SPA 2021 exhibition was held in Edinburgh in November 2021. Twitter and Instagram were used extensively to promote the artists and the Scottish Portrait Awards.

Other Additional Information

The Trust has secured the City Art Centre in Edinburgh to host the Scottish Landscape Awards for four months in 2023. While our donations dropped in 2021, we have now secured further support for the SPA competition. We have also recently received funding to enable the Trust to employ the services of a freelance media communicator to work on the promotion of our exciting new Scottish Landscape Award and raise the profile of the Scottish Arts Trust.

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2021 which are set out on pages 4 to 9

Respective responsibilities of the trustees and the independent examiner

The trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustees Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).
