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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2024

The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The organisation's purposes are to advance community development, promote the voluntary sector and the effectiveness/efficiency of charities, and advance education, by:

- 1.1 Providing opportunities for social enterprises to learn how to run their businesses better (including but without limitation by facilitating action learning and the exchange of information);
- 1.2 Providing opportunities for social enterprises to grow their businesses (including but without limitation initiatives that identify trading opportunities and facilitate joint trading opportunities);
- 1.3 Promoting goods and services provided by social enterprises; And on the basis that the business of the organisation will be carried on for the benefit of the community within South Ayrshire.

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Significant activities

There's been a lot happening with SASEN over the past year.

The SASEN board spent some time revising the Constitution to ensure that it met the aims of the network in going forward. Once this had been completed, we were able to officially go out and ask social enterprises across South Ayrshire if they'd like to join the network. We're very glad that so many of you agreed to join us!

At the end of last year, we organised a small cohort of social enterprises to go on a Community Exchange for a couple of days to Scottish Borders Social Enterprise Chamber. Lots of great organisations were visited and ideas generated for all on the exchange.

We were delighted that we were successful in obtaining the Social Enterprise Places Award for South Ayrshire from Social Enterprise Scotland and had a launch event to celebrate at Narture workshop space in February of this year.

SASEN also obtained some additional funding from ARIA over the past year. This enabled our Development Officer to visit rural enterprises across South Ayrshire and obtain a greater understanding of what we require to do as a network as we go forward in the coming year.

Next steps for SASEN over the coming year, is to look at how we're sharing relevant information with our members through social media channels and develop opportunities via greater partnership working. Lots to do.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Principal funding sources

The organisation received grants for the development of the South Ayrshire Social Enterprise Network from the Scottish Government. SASEN also obtained some additional funding from ARIA over the past year.

Reserves policy

The charity has limited turnover, being primarily a networking organisation. Reserves policy is to seek to maintain a reserve of around £5,000, which would equate to at least three months of active delivery. This policy was met throughout the year.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The organisation operates under a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) having charitable status under the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, The Charity is governed by a written constitution.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

New trustees are put forward by the members of the company for election.

Organisational structure

The Board of Trustees meets monthly to review progress on activities and take the necessary and appropriate decisions as necessary and appropriate. The Board has a chairman who provides updates and discusses the day to day operation and financial matters relating to the core activity of the charity. Recommendations for further discussion and decisions are made at the Board meeting.

Training and relevant information on SASEN is given to new trustees.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2024

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

2. TRUSTEES' REMUNERATION AND BENEFITS
