Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (or Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form)).

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session is responsible for both the spiritual and overall management of the congregation's affairs. The Kirk Session, which is chaired by the Minister, meets seven times a year.

Objectives and Activities

St Ninian's & Forglen Parish Church is a congregation of the Church of Scotland which, as a national church, acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of the Christian faith to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry.

Our vision as a congregation is to be a church where the people of our parish community can experience the love of God, can find faith in Christ, and can grow in that faith and share it with others. To this end, we undertake a range of activities relating to worship, prayer, pastoral care, fellowship, hospitality, outreach and learning.

Achievements and Performance

The main contribution to our vision during 2023 continued to be our Sunday Church services (open and inclusive to all and providing opportunities for worship, prayer, Bible teaching, and fellowship); pastoral care (supporting those experiencing various life and health issues, or bereavement); schools work (including establishing an SU Group in our local primary school); weekly Friendship Cafe (popular with many people who don't otherwise come to church), and various fellowship groups.

2023 saw a further increase in the number of people attending Sunday services and the weekly Friendship Cafe, at least matching if not exceeding, pre-Covid levels. Church fellowship groups continued to be popular with regulars. Given the church's excellent acoustics and flexible space, several third party musical events were hosted including the Scottish Chamber Orchestra, as part of their Rural Summer Tour. Our livestream facilities continued to be well used, providing online access to our Sunday services and a number of funerals to those unable to attend in person.

In line with the Presbytery Mission Plan, we also began conversations, and holding bi-monthly joint services, with our four neighbouring Church of Scotland congregations, working towards the best way to all join together, probably in 2024.

Financial Review

The principal source of general income is from regular and one-off donations made by members and church attenders, much of which is Gift-aided. 110 members made regular donations by bank standing order, and 25 by FWO envelopes, of which 90 were registered for Gift Aid. Income from other sources, such as room lets, funerals and weddings, which had been badly hit by COVID restrictions in the previous two years, showed a steady recovery during the year, as activities resumed.

Several significant items of building maintenance and technology upgrades originally budgeted during the year had to be put on hold as a consequence of Presbytery restrictions on such expenditure. This was a consequence of the new Presbytery Mission Plan which will see just one of the two Turriff Church of Scotland buildings being retained, with a decision as to which one expected in 2024.

Reserves Policy

It is Church policy to hold funds to cover six to nine months expenditure. At the year end the balance of unrestricted funds amounted to £205,767. Some of these funds are earmarked for future Ministries activity in line with our Vision. The Church also holds restricted funds of $\pm 10,593$. The overall level of funds remains strong. The trustees set an annual budget at the beginning of each year, and closely monitor actual expenditure against this budget throughout the year. Sufficient reserves are held to cover any significant unforeseen expenditure.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Independent Examiner's Report

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2023 which are set out on pages 6 to 10.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

An examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

5. Minister's Stipend

All Church of Scotland congregations contribute to the National Stipend Fund which bears the costs of all ministers' stipends and employer's contributions for national insurance, pension and housing and loan fund. Ministers' stipends are paid in accordance with the national stipend scale, which is related to years of service. For the year under review the minimum stipend was £30,135 and the maximum stipend (in the fifth and subsequent years) was £37,032.
