Trustee's Annual Report

Structure, Governance & Management Governing Document

The Church is rooted in the Baptist tradition, is congregational in its form of government, and undertakes to manage its own affairs, free from all ecclesiastical authority.

The Church is controlled according to its constitution and continues as an unincorporated charity. The Church includes the membership and the Deacons. Membership is open to all who publicly profess faith in the Lord Jesus, and applicants will be accepted for membership upon satisfying the Church as to the sincerity of their faith in Christ.

The Deacons are responsible for managing the day to day affairs of the Church. Meetings of the general membership take place at least three times per year, one meeting being designated the Annual Church Meeting. All Deacons are volunteers and receive no remuneration.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

The office bearers shall consist of not fewer than six Deacons, including the Secretary and Treasurer. An election of Deacons shall be held once every three years and the appointment of the Secretary and Treasurer shall be approved at the Annual Church Meeting every three years.

The Deacons may appoint up to four Trustees to deal with all legal matters relating to the Church, including full powers to sell, excamb, lease or grant security over any church property and to invest funds of the Church as they see fit.

Objectives and Activities

The aim of the Church which is affiliated to the Baptist Union of Scotland is to worship together in Spirit and in Truth, build the members up in Faith and proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ in word and action. During the year the Church remained strong in Spirit.

Achievements and Performance

Following a period of consultation and the production of a feasibility study to look at a way forward the Members of the Church agreed a "Third Way": the Church would continue but 50% of the total funds as at 31st December 2024 less any outstanding costs relating to the maintenance project (see below) and relevant consultancy fees would be donated to Christian charitable causes. Two committees were set up, a Legacy Group which would identify suitable charitable projects which met agreed criteria and a Future Strategy Group that would review the Constitution with the intention of becoming a SCIO and progress the appointment of a Church Community Development Worker. It is hoped that a meeting to be held in January 2025 will discuss and approve the projects that are being proposed by the Legacy Group and the intention is to advertise for a Church Community Development Worker in February. Significant work has also been done with regard to the new constitution.

A programme of maintenance was carried out, specifically roof repairs, interior and exterior painting, new carpets and work on the basement to make it suitable for letting as office space. This included work to protect the basement from a potential flood risk. These were one off projects and outwith normal maintenance costs.

The investment strategy was reviewed during the year. As a result some of the funds were realised and placed on a platform with Insignis which yielded a better rate of return. This has resulted in investment income of £51,279 (£8,954 to 31st December 2023).

The congregation is united on its way forward and continues to meet regularly every two weeks with a rich variety of preachers taking the services.

Trustee's Annual Report (continued)

Financial Review

In the year to 31 December 2024, the Church incurred a net deficit of £22,452 (2023: deficit of £8,016). While there is an ongoing pattern of deficit, the work of the church can be funded comfortably from the proceeds of the Manse sale in November 2021. At 31 December 2024, reserves stood at £1,022,240 (2023: £1,044,692) with all of these being unrestricted, although 50% of the total funds as at 31st December 2024 less any outstanding costs relating to the maintenance project and relevant consultancy fees are designated for donation to Christian charitable causes.

Reserves Policy

It is the policy of the Church to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free reserves, at a level equivalent to three months expenditure. The Trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the organisation's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised.

Based on accounts to 31 December 2024, ordinary expenditure for 3 months amounts to £11,267 (excluding larger repair works done in the year). Free reserves at this date were £511,120 (50% of total reserves) and the Trustees are satisfied that this policy is being met.

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Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Canonmills Baptist Church

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2024 set out on pages 6 to 9.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

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1. Basis of Accounting

2. Nature and purpose of funds

Unrestricted funds are those that may be used at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. The trustees maintain a single unrestricted fund for the day-to-day running of the charity.

Restricted Funds may only be used for specific purposes. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for specific purposes.

3. Related Party Transactions

During the year, the Church paid subscriptions of £172.50 (2023: £184) to the Baptist Union of Great Britain, to which the Church is affiliated, and £1,000 (2023: £1,000) to the Scottish Baptist Fund.
