OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Charitable Purposes

Our purpose is to provide a pre-school nursery and playgroup for children in the area.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

The aim is to prepare pre-school children for primary school and to follow the national curriculum for excellence.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

We have had no free places this year with 31 children on our register. It is lovely to see our centre busy with lots of happy children taking the lead in their own learning. We have employed a modern apprentice who is doing their SVQ 2 and we are in the position of being able to employ them for another year, as an apprentice, to study for their SVQ 3. We now employ 5 full time members of staff and all staff did up to date Child Protection training online.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period (cont)

We have had a very busy year! We were full to capacity this year with children ranging in age from 3 to 5 years. We were in the position to employ another apprentice this year so we now employ 6 members of staff. Two members of staff are working towards completing SVQ 3 and one member of staff has started the Graduate Apprenticeship BA Early Learning and Childcare qualification. This will ensure the children will be supported on their learning journey by confident, knowledgeable staff. All staff have been updating their Child Protection training, completing a Food Hygiene course and attending monthly workshops run by Highland Council covering various topics.

The Vintage Car Club held a fundraising event and the money raised was given to the setting. This was used to buy some picnic benches, to replace our broken ones, and some gardening tools to support the children's learning outdoors. The local Santa Run donated the money raised to us which was used to further develop our home corner. It is lovely that the local community supports us so well.

One of the actions in our Improvement Plan was to involve the parents more in the group. We have done this by holding various stay and play sessions, inviting parents to our sports day and Christmas concert. The committee applied for a grant to buy some iPads so that we could introduce Dojo to the parents. This is a program that allows us to communicate with parents, and them with us, privately. Photos and achievements are shared between home and the setting making the link between parents stronger. The office bearers have been arranging more regular meetings with the rest of the committee, ensuring everyone is kept informed. Monthly newsletters are issued as well as updates on our private Facebook page.

Staff received their annual pay rise. Any surplus money will be kept in reserve for quieter years so that we can continue to offer the same standard of care and learning experiences for the children. Included in reserves are funds to cover any potential redundancy liabilities in the future.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

The grant funding received is calculated with reference to the number of children attending nursery during the year and therefore when the class sizes are higher a surplus may build up. These reserves may be required to fund the deficit in any year where the numbers are lower and help to sustain the group.

Donated facilities and services

The trustees donate their time in order to attend meetings and carry out administrative duties for the group. Gloria Sinclair received £400 for the administrative duties she carried out.

Reserves

As a result of the surplus of $\pounds 18,863$ for the year, the association held unrestricted funds of $\pounds 215,254$ at the year end.
