Constitution

During the year to 31 March 2017, the constitution of the charity, formerly known as Gorgie War Memorial Hall Community Centre Association, was amended and on 3 February 2017 the charity was recognised as a SCIO (Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation) by the Office of Scottish Charity Regulator.

All assets and liabilities of the unincorporated charity, Gorgie War Memorial Hall Community Centre Association, were transferred to The Gorgie Mem SCIO on 3 February 2017.

Structure, governance and management

The Board (previously known as the Management Committee), whose membership is set out on the contents page of the Report and Financial Statements, manages the Charity. The Board consists of a minimum of 3 and not more than 15 elected members. Board members are normally nominated from the circle of acquaintances of current members and are elected at the Annual General Meeting.

All Board members are familiar with the work of the charity. If there are any areas where additional training is required, this will be discussed at a Board meeting and a solution identified.

The day-to-day management is the responsibility of the Board.

Objectives and organisational structure

The Charity's main purposes are:

- a. To advance education among the residents of the area of Gorgie and other areas within the City of Edinburgh and surrounds (the beneficiaries)
- b. To provide or assist in the provision of facilities for recreation or other leisure time occupation, for the benefit of the said beneficiaries where such provision is
 - i) In the benefit of social welfare
 - ii) made with the objects of improving the conditions of life of people in the Area of Gorgie and City of Edinburgh.
- c. to advance citizenship and promote volunteering among the beneficiaries through the provision of opportunities for them to take an active part in the civic life of their communities.

Review of financial position

The total incoming resources available to the SCIO in year to 31 March 2025 amounted to £9,802 (2024 : £4,400). Total expenditure was £6,213 (2024: £2,887) resulting in a surplus at the end of the financial year of £3,589 (2024: £1,513).

Reserves policy

The reserves are held to meet the cost of the future refurbishment of the centre and purchase of new equipment.

Risk management policy

The Board has assessed the major risks to which the SCIO is exposed and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate those risks.

Review of developments and activities during the year

Twice per week we have a well-attended toddler drop in playgroup during school term time. We managed to have a Christmas party for the toddler group with a real Santa which was very much appreciated by those that attended.

We are fortunate to continue to have classes in Yoga and Zumba running. Zumba has kept up two sessions a week.

We have a monthly support group for ADHD members, hopefully increasing to two a month.

Health all round have been attending fortnightly, moving to Wednesdays, for Polish and Ukranian members with mobility issues.

Dominocos Republic have been attending a few times this year.

The charity Dads Rock are still running weekly playgroups, regular parenting workshops, hosting their Halloween Party, AGM and Christmas party at the hall. As well as making Gorgie Mem their main office location.

Big Hearts run twice a month teaching cooking to youth groups.

The Welcoming come along on Friday afternoons with approx 40-50 visitors each session.

TaeKwondo have started recently running kids and ladies only sessions on Mondays and Fridays.

Where possible we have also tried to make the hall available to other local groups.

The trustees have been extremely grateful to to keeping the hall functioning so well.

Future plans

We are looking to increase hall lets by building relationships within the local community to identify need and opportunities for provision of classes and groups. We are also working to strengthen the Board, through increasing numbers of Trustees and a clearer understanding of roles and responsibilities.
