Arbroath & Montrose District Scout Council Trustees Annual Report Year ended 31st March 2025

The Board of Trustees have pleasure in presenting their report together with the financial statements and the independent examiner's report for the year ended 31 March 2025.

#### Name & Address

The District's name is Arbroath & Montrose District Scout Council and it may be contacted via the District Administrator

#### Constitution & Purpose

The Scout District is constituted in terms of the rules of the Scout Association which is a charitable body incorporated by Royal Charter. The Scout Council is a registered Scottish Charity - No SC026948. The purpose of Scouting is to actively engage and support young people in their personal development empowering them to make a positive contribution to society.

#### Governance

The Scout Council has a Trustee Board with 7 Trustees as follows; (there was 1 vacancy during year)

Trustees are recruited and appointed in accordance with the Policy & Rules of the Scout Association

#### Activities & Achievements over the past 12 months -

During the year the Trustees have worked hard to develop a new structure that is better supporting us to understand and manage our assests and resources. We adopted an updated District Development Plan which has ambitious targets for growth across the Scout District as well as developing different ways of working through the development of a District website. Through the transformation of scouting this has led the Scout District to adopt a more teams based approach that has been supported by the Trustees with the creation of different teams. Further targeted recruitment of adult volunteers will be needed to fill current vacancies and also further support scouting across the Scout District. In January 2025 our membership totalled 522 (2024 - 460). The increase of 62 members is a 14% growth. This growth mainly came from the establishment of 4 Squirrel Dreys across the Scout District to extend our scouting delivery to young people aged 4 & 5 years old. This would not have been possible without the wonderful volunteers who came forward to support with the set up of these Dreys. The District continues our programme of renevation of property to further support scouting delivery for future generations. This year we have undertaken improvements to make all facilities at inverkeilor Scout Hall fully accessible and planning has been undertaken for substantial upgrade of the Queen Street Scout Hall in Montrose with fundraissing underway. The Legacy from the late Pat Elrick continues to benefit a wide section of Scouting in the District and includes support for adult volunteers to attend international activities, towards further learning opportunities and to access activities at the Jock Neish Scouting Centre.

#### Reserves Policy

The Trustees believe that around six months of annual expenditure is an appropriate level of reserves in order to cover the timing differences between receipts & payments and to allow for any unexpected items of expenditure on the upkeep of premises and to meet utility costs.

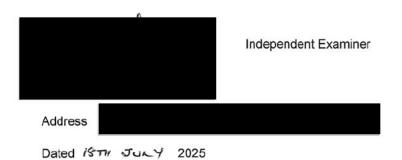
#### Basis of Independent examiner's statement
