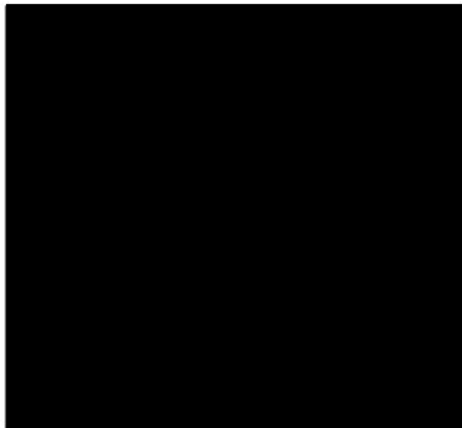

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

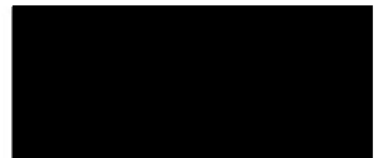
Governing document

The Partnership is an unincorporated association and was established under the terms of its constitution dated 31 August 2005. The organisation was recognised as a Scottish charity with effect from 31 August 2005.

Recruitment and appointment of trustees

For the purposes of the charity regulations, the members of the Management Committee are the charity's trustees. The constitution states that the committee shall consist of four members, being a Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Treasurer and Secretary, who are elected or re-elected by the members of the charity at the Annual General Meeting which is held in September each year. When a position becomes vacant, the remaining trustees invite other individuals with similar interests to become a trustee.

Organisational structure

The Management Committee meet on an ad-hoc basis, but rarely less than once a month. More pressing matters are dealt with using e-mail.

Full membership of the partnership is open to Christians aged 18 and over resident on the Isle of Lewis and further afield in Scotland. Junior membership is open to Christians under the age of 18 resident on the Isle of Lewis and further afield in Scotland. Junior members do not have the right to vote at member meetings but may elect from themselves one representative who shall have full voting rights at meetings of the Partnership.

Risk management

The trustees have identified the following risks and have sought to mitigate them as described:

- The aims and objectives of the charity are on a practical level at least very much dependant on raising a certain amount of funds, i.e. sponsoring children, buying land etc. The mitigation of this risk is a planned fundraising programme.
- Another financial risk is foreign currency exchange losses, which at one time previously was a big problem when changing money back into Sterling after a trip out to The Gambia one year. The trustees feel that the best way to mitigate this kind of thing is to have detailed cash flow systems in place so that only what cash is needed is taken out.
- A further risk identified has been in relation to the public perception of the charity. It is important that the public are clear what the aims and objectives of the charity are. The key facts document and the regular updates of the newly-launched website mitigate this.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Following a trip to Serrekunda in The Gambia in November 2004 a vision was borne to spread the Gospel to a predominantly Muslim nation. A partnership was subsequently established between Christians in The Gambia and Christians in Scotland. This partnership was named The Gambia Partnership. The Scottish committee is based in Stornoway on the Western Isles and the Gambian committee is based primarily in Serrekunda. All committee members are Christians.

The Gambia Partnership was essentially set up to serve Jesus Christ. It is hoped that this will be achieved through the following four key aims: -

1. Gospel Outreach and Teaching

Support Churches and believers to reach out with the Good News of Jesus Christ through witnessing, distribution of tracts and print and audio Bibles.

Holding regular meetings at different locations to provide spiritually enriching teaching.

2. Education

Provide educational support to individuals and communities through child sponsorship and building projects.

3. Micro-Enterprise Projects

Offer individuals the start up capital to engage in small business enterprise. This removes economic disadvantages and allows individuals and families the opportunity to become financially self-sufficient.

4. Village Development Works

Engage with communities and villages in an attempt to meet their physical needs, where led to do so. These needs may vary from water projects to disaster relief and many things besides.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The past year has seen the core partnership activity of child sponsorship and school support continuing.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The charity has ongoing costs of sponsoring children in The Gambia. Payments are made to the schools on an annual basis and are funded from restricted donations from sponsors.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of The Gambia Partnership

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 October 2024 which are set out on pages five to seven.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). The charity's trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1)(d) of the 2006 Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1)(c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the 2006 Accounts Regulations. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

Independent examiners' statement

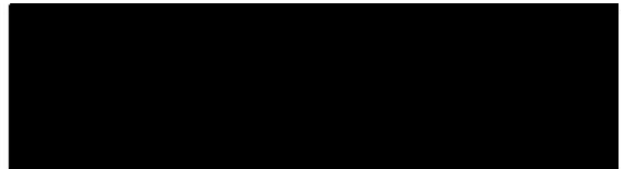
In the course of my examination, no matter has come to my attention:
