

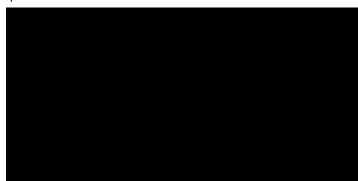

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT YEAR TO 31 JANUARY 2024

The Management Committee have the pleasure in presenting their report and the financial statements of the Charity for the year ended 31st January 2024.

The Management Committee

The Management Committee who served the Charity during the period were as follows:



Structure, Governance and Management

All the decisions are made by the Management Committee. The Management Committee are elected for a term of one year by the members of the Association at the AGM. The exception to this is the President who serves for two years.

Risk Management

The Management Committee have assessed the major risks to which the Charity is exposed, particularly those related to the operations and finances of the Association, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate the exposure to major risks.

Investment policy

The Management Committee have considered the most appropriate policy for investing funds and has found that an instant access savings account gives the best level of security and flexibility that the charity currently requires for the Society's funds.

Objectives and Activities

The objectives and activities of the Society are as follows:

- To advance the education of the public in the performing arts, particularly amateur musical theatre.
- To study and promote the performance and appreciation of music and social activities within the local community.
- To support charities and local organisations as deemed suitable by the Society, where this furthers a charitable purpose.

Achievements and Performance

Over the past 12 months, Loudoun Musical Society (LMS) has continued to grow its reputation within the local community.

The Society was given the opportunity to participate in "Let's Celebrate, Back to Broadway" – hosted by Celebrate Kilmarnock – in July 2023. The event was free to attend and was an opportunity to promote the performance of music within the local area. A grant was also received from



Celebrate Kilmarnock to support the Society's performance overheads. This grant is detailed in the Financial Review section of the report.

In October 2023, the Society successfully staged a production of "Legally Blonde: The Musical." The Society were able to perform our typical six-performance show week to near sold-out audiences at the Palace Theatre, Kilmarnock without hinderance. The show run also included a British Sign Language (BSL) interpreted performance following the positive feedback received from the previous year — the addition provided access to the performance for more than 40 members of the local deaf community.

The Society's Concert Party continued to meet following the restarting of their rehearsals in 2022. A total of 8 performance events were attended and 35 members participated across the season.

Financial Review

The surplus for the year was £2008. These funds will be added to the Society reserves and used to support future endeavours. All income and expenditure within the year was related to activities held within the financial year.

With respect to the Annual Show, a balance of £886 is owed to the Society. Were the balance settled prior to year-end, the surplus recorded by the Society would have been £2,894.

This year, the Society endeavoured to support many local organisations and charities and made the following community contributions:

In addition to the contributions above, the Society participated in a "Pretty Muddy" event in support of Cancer Research UK.
Representatives from the Society raised a total of £853.
The Society managed to attract £1,000 of grant funding from Celebrate Kilmarnock.

The plans for future years remain consistent with the Society's current activities.

Trustee remuneration

The trustees did not receive any remuneration during the year.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT YEAR TO 31 JANUARY 2024



Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Loudoun Musical Society

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 January 2024 which are set out on pages 1 to 5.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1)(d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1)(c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

Independent examiner's statement

In the course of my examination, no matter has come to my attention

- 1. Which gives me reasonable cause to believe that in any material respect the requirements:
- to keep accounting records in accordance with Section 44 (1)(a) of the 2005 Act and regulation 4 of of the 2006 Accounts Regulations, and
- to prepare accounts which accord with the accounting records and comply with Regulation 9 of the 2006 Accounts Regulations have not been met, or
- 2. to which, in my opinion, attention should be drawn in order to enable a proper understanding of the accounts to be reached.



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
