Structure, Governance and Management

Constitution

Net Ministries Scotland is a Single Tier Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO). It was registered in its current legal form by OSCR on 27 July 2015. It is governed by its constitution, which was adopted on 5 January 2016.

Appointment of trustees

The structure of the organisation consists of the charity's trustees, who are also the organisation's only members and comprise of the organisation's board.

The board must arrange an annual general meeting ('AGM') of the charity's trustees in each calendar year, reporting on the immediately preceding financial year of the organisation.

At each AGM, all the charity trustees must retire from office but may then be re-elected.

Administration

The board may delegate any of their functions or powers to sub-committees; a sub-committee must include at least one charity trustee.

The board may also delegate to the Convenor of the organisation (or holder of any other post) such powers (but not their responsibilities) as they may consider appropriate.

When delegating powers, the board must set out appropriate conditions (which must include an obligation to report regularly to the board).

Any delegation of powers may be revoked or altered by the board at any time.

The rules of procedure for each sub-committee and the provisions relating to membership of each sub-committee, shall be set by the board.

Objectives and Activities

Charitable purposes

The organisation is established for charitable purposes only and the objectives are:

- The advancement of religion and education by operating exclusively for religious, educational and charitable purposes.
- The area within which the organisation shall operate (in this constitution referred to as the 'Area of Benefit') shall be Scotland and the surrounding areas.
- The organisation shall promote (but not promote exclusively) its activities and delivery operations to people within the 'Area of Benefit' who are young Scottish Catholics. These people will be the organisation's beneficiaries.

Principle Activities, Achievements and Performance

The mission of NET Scotland is to inspire young people to love Christ and embrace the life of the Church. Every August, young Catholics between the ages of 18-28 devote nine months to serve with NET (National Evangelisation Teams).

Our team of young people are recruited from all over the world. They receive four weeks of spiritual and ministry training and formation from our Mission Partners, NET Ministries USA, in St. Paul, Minnesota. On arrival in Scotland they benefit from a further week of Scottish induction training before working as volunteer missionaries for the next nine months. Their core work involves a presentation of the Christian gospel message to young school aged Catholics through music, drama, teaching and personal testimony.

Our mission is fulfilled by:

- Young people evangelising young people
- Inspiring young people to give a year to serve with NET
- Witness to adult families and households through 'Host home ministry'
- · Partnership with schools & others in youth ministries

NET is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation funded through individual donations, retreat fees and grants and is governed by a board of trustees.

Achievements and Performance.

A team of ten missionaries and two Supervisors were recruited to serve in the ministry from September 2023 through to June 2024. The schedule of ministry for 2023/24 included 142 days of retreats which comprised 32 weeks of Chaplaincy Support ministry in eight schools, 57 full day school retreats and 5 Diocesan/Parish day retreats. This included 4 weeks of retreats in the North of England and in the London area.

Time for rest, recreation and training was incorporated into the schedule and this included;

- On arrival in Scotland, one week of Induction which included rest and training
- 4 day December retreat
- 3 week Christmas break
- 4 day January training
- One week Easter break in April
- 'Wrap up' week to conclude the year and help the missionaries transition from NET

We continued the work of recruitment, receiving and processing enquiries via our website. We continued to connect with likeminded Youth ministries and organisations including; Archdiocese of Glasgow RCAG youth, Youth 2000, The Ascent, NET Ireland, Generation Hope, Craig Lodge, University Chaplaincies, Joel's Bar and The Faith movement

Financial Review

Our main source of funding is fees charged to schools, grants received from individuals and organisations and funds raised by the individual missionaries.

Unrestricted funds: During the year, the charity received donations of £35,231 (2023: £39,578), grants of £60,330 (2023: £25,049) and school fees of £73,620 (2023: £62,000). Expenses of £140,494 (2023: £159,990) were incurred during the year. This left the charity with a surplus of £28,770 (2023: deficit £19,172).

Reserve Policy

The trustee's policy is to maintain reserves at around 2-3 months of normal running costs in order to meet commitments and to cover any unexpected expenditure.

Going Concern

The trustees have no concerns

Plans for Future Periods

- We plan to have a full ten person team and two Supervisors in the session 2024/25.
- We will continue to offer a high quality retreat service to schools and parishes in Scotland and in the rest of the UK.
- Recruitment of missionaries is a key focus for us in the coming year. It is our ambition to increase the number of missionaries who work with us to meet the ever increasing demand for our service. To this end we plan to employ a full time Mission Engagement Manager to focus on the work of recruitment.
- We will continue to reach out to and partner with similar youth organisations throughout the UK and Ireland.
- · We plan to grow income streams from donations and grant applications in both the UK and USA.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of

For the year to 31 July 2024

I have examined the financial statements of NET Ministries Scotland for the period ended 31 July 2024 which are set out on pages six to nine.


Independent examiner's statement
