For the third year we had interruptions at the Town Hall with a new heating installation, meaning the venue was closed from October (and through to March 2024). Still, audience numbers were feeling better. We installed a new projector thanks to funding from Creative Scotland, which is a much better image with less heat emissions and lower running costs.

Our current balance is above that. Excess reserves will be spent on film activities within Orkney to promote the purposes of the charity, and upgrading equipment.
