Structure, Governance and Management

Constitution

The Charity is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (a SCIO). It was registered in its current legal form on 8 May 2017. The charity was previously an unincorporated association but changed its legal form to a SCIO. The assets of the unincorporated association were transferred to the SCIO on the 1 June 2017. It has a single tier structure and as such the Trustees are the members of the charity.

Appointment of trustees

Membership is open to the parents and appointed guardians of the children attending the organisation, to the organisation's voluntary staff and other interested adults who have an interest in further the objects. Employees of the organisation are not eligible for membership.

The board of trustees meets monthly. The maximum number of trustees is 12, and the minimum number is 5. Any member of the organisation can be elected as a trustee by members at the AGM, and in addition the board of trustees can co-opt any member as a trustee. The current board of trustees includes parents of children currently attending the club, parents of older children, and other interested members of the local community.

Objectives and Activities

Charitable purposes

Our purposes, as recorded in our constitution, to provide out of School care to 4-14 year olds. administration arrangements are set out in our constitution.

Activities

The organisation has responsibility for an out-of-school club, which provides care for primary-age children after school and during school holidays, allowing parents flexibility for work study, or other caring responsibilities. Children are collected on foot from Anstruther Primary School, and by taxi from St Monan's Primary School; during school holidays families drop children off in the moming.

Care provided by professional staff working with modern guidelines for child-led play, regulated by the Care Inspectorate. We have outdoor play space immediately outside the club, and access to Bankie Park just one minute away.

Structure, Governance and Management (continued)

Achievements and Performance

We have successfully managed the transfer of the service from the charity which formerly operated it, to this new SCIO which provides a better framework for trustees, members, and applying for external funding. We have had some change-over of staffing, but managed to recruit replacements as necessary, and arrange training. Numbers of children attending during term-time are rising, and we had good attendance during both the Easter and summer school holidays. As well as providing a vital service for the community, high usage means more financial stability for the organisation.

Financiai review

Our main funding is fees which are charged to parents. We receive an annual grant form Fife Council to assist with general running costs and transport for children attending from beyond Anstruther. We also receive some funding for 'protected places' for families in need from Fife Council, and some ad hoc grants and donations from individuals and organisations.

Reserves policy

The trustees' policy is to retain 3 months worth of normal running costs in order to meet commitments and to cover any unexpected expenditure. Three months expenditure stands at £8974 and reserves are in excess of this at £17389. The trustees believe that this in still in an acceptable range but will continue to monitor the position.

Plans for future period

Grants from Fife Council are reducing, so we need to keep a close eye on our fee income and external fundraising. However numbers of children attending during term-time continue to be very healthy, and we do not have plans for major changes in the service. Our professional staff will continue to pursue relevant qualification, with our support. Longer term, we plan to investigate the possibility of acquiring our own transport, to make us less dependent on the availability and costs of taxis/bus hire for regular pick-ups and holiday day-trips.
