Objectives and activities

Lochee Community Larder & Café SCIO opened in August 2019 as a charity in Lochee area of Dundee, which is considered an area of deprivation (SIMD, 2020).

Our aims are to fight food poverty by providing a more sustainable model of food provision where the community can access, and choose, free or low-cost food and money advice within their local area. Our strategy is guided by the principles of dignity and empowering communities to be involved in decision making and having a sense of control over their own future, while continuing to tackle the deepening inequalities fuelled by the rising cost-of-living crisis.

Our larder uses a choice-based system giving our customers a "shopping experience". As of the end of April 2024 we reach more than 4000 people per week. (People reached is counted as the whole household of the shopper).

With a community chef coming on board our community café has become ever more popular, and we are usually serving over 100 meals each session. One of our objectives has been to reduce the social isolation felt by many in the community, and so we love to see our customers building connections and friendships.

Over the winter months we also extend our opening times, and have a "Cosy" Open space where anyone can come and be fed while also feeling safe and warm. As always it is a welcoming space to help those struggling with food and fuel poverty. This service will start again in October 2024.

Our customers are the driver for how we expand our services. During opening we now have a community guider on premises who is always there to help with support for welfare, benefits, housing, debt advice. Whether this be helping to fiull out applications, telephone on behalf of our customers or signpost to other services. Laptops are also available for our customers use.

As well as working hard keeping the shop and café running our volunteers are always there to lend a friendly ear. Our volunteers all come from the local community and may also be struggling but we try to give them a purpose for their day.

Structure, governance and management

Type of governing document

The Lochee Community Larder & Café is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) with voting members other than its charity Trustees. The SCIO is governed by a constitution, with charity Trustees being elected at the Annual General Meeting. Any vacant seats may be filled by a nomination and cooption by the existing Trustees during the year. All Trustees are volunteers and undertake activities to further the objects of Lochee Community Larder & Café SCIO as required with no remuneration or financial benefit received for their time.

General structure

The structure of the organisation consists of:-

the MEMBERS - who have the right to attend members' meetings (including any annual general meeting) and have important powers under the constitution; in particular, the members appoint people to serve on the board and take decisions on changes to the constitution itself;

the BOARD - who hold regular meetings, and generally control the activities of the organisation; for example, the board is responsible for monitoring and controlling the financial position of the organisation.

The people serving on the board are referred to as CHARITY TRUSTEES.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

At each AGM, the members may elect any member (unless they are debarred from membership) to be a charity trustee.

The board may at any time appoint any member (unless they are debarred from membership) to be a charity trustee.

At each AGM, all of the charity trustees elected/appointed shall retire from office – but shall then be eligible for re-election.

A charity trustee retiring at an AGM will be deemed to have been re-elected unless: -

they advise the board prior to the conclusion of the AGM that they dnot wish to be re-appointed as a charity trustee; or

an election process was held at the AGM and they were not among those elected/re-elected through that process; or

a resolution for the re-election of that charity trustee was put to the AGM and was not carried.

Achievements and performance

A major achievement over the last year has been our ability to keep up with the increase in demand for all of our services.

This has included but is not limited to the dedication of our hardworking volunteers; increased fundraising via grants, donations and fundraising events; increasing the capacity of our storage facilities mainly purchasing new fridges and freezers for the additional storage of foods needed.

This increase has been across the board in both the larder and the cafe

This has followed our objectives of fighting food poverty and reducing social isolation in the community.

The café now also employs a community chef which has been instrumental in the café side being able to expand rapidly to ensure everyone who needs it is supported.

Our cosy space becomes a central meeting point for people who would otherwise be very "isolated".

We also see so many new friendships blossoming. From quite nervous newcomers arriving and soon seeing them being comfortable in the café and part of our community "family".

We are often told by some customers that they would not eat if it wasn't for our café and larder.

Some anonymous feedback we get are:

"It's been a lifesaver, saved me a couple of times from going hungry. I am grateful for having this community. Thanks!!!"

"I'm so grateful for this larder. It's not just go in for a cup of coffee. It's actually great to get out of the house, and interact with other people from the community. As if this place didn't exist, I would be lying on my couch.....it's so important on my mental health. It's so important for me

Another specific example was a family who had been referred for a parcel. When the person came to collect the shopping, they then stayed and had lunch in the café, and took food away in takeaway containers for the rest of the family. The feedback from them was that "it is such a huge relief as we have no electric".

Relationships

We have built on our many relationships this past year.

We work very closely with the Dundee Community Food Network (DCFN) and Fans Supporting Foodbanks (FSF). All the services within this network work together and we are always helping each other.

Volunteers

We like to ensure our volunteers are feeling appreciated and motivated to help with their own struggles whether it be mental health or other. They have all enjoyed Team building days which help to keep moral up

Our annual fun day for community families is always well received as well as our fundraiser evenings in conjunction with DCFN and FSF

Future plans

In the coming financial year, we intend to incorporate the Lochee Community Shed under our umbrella. The leases for the workshop will be taken over by Lochee Community Larder & Café. This will add another service to allow the local community to get involved in DIY projects.


As well as continuing to help combat hunger and loneliness in our community, our plan with the café is to assist people with easy recipes, that they can make at home, with the produce they can get from the larder.

Basis of Accounting

Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
