The former unincorporated association became a SCIO and registered charity on 29 November 2018.

The charity is governed by its Constitution as a one tier SCIO operating under OSCR guidance.

The advancement of the arts, heritage, culture or science including the preservation, including restorative works, of Old St Peter's Kirk, Thurso and its graveyard for current and future generations.

The advancement of citizenship or community development (including rural or urban regeneration and the promotion of civic responsibility, volunteering, the voluntary sector or the effectiveness or efficiency of charities).

Working with The Highland Council to acquire the Kirk under community asset transfer legislation.

Research the Kirk's history and interpret it for citizens and visitors.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Last year, we reported on the condition surveys we had planned as one of our main charitable objectives being preservation of the monument and for interpretation and education. We secured funding not only for the surveys but also to develop a website. We have spent many months in discussion with the council and Historic Environment Scotland which were not helped by council reorganisation and staffing changes. We are finally getting closer to seeing some physical restoration work carried out. We have been encouraged by HES to submit Scheduled Monument Consent for repairs to the monuments inside the kirk. This should allow entry once again which will allow us to weed the area and clean up any litter. Our first structural priority with preservation of the Kirk are the repairs to the roof of the Bishops Apartment which will need a separate permission as a structural design will be required for this and will take time. Funding will have to be sourced for this. The setting up of a website has been setback due to illness of our supplier, and we need to restart with a new provider. We do, however, have a skeleton of a website already in place, and it's a case of continuing to progress this once a new developer has been assigned. We have had a full year of visits and thanks to our volunteers who try to be present for a few hours every day (weather permitting). Visitors are surprised and delighted to get a personal tour plus leaflet information in multiple languages, we have added Spanish and Catalan to our collection, and we have many great comments in our visitors' book. Donations are healthy as a result. We have recorded over 2000 visitors to the Kirk over the past year, but we know there are many more who visit when we are not present. Over the year we had 15 cruise ship visits, potentially 12,000 tourists, but often the smaller ships yield more visitors than the larger ones. We took part in the national 'Doors Open' days in September 24 and will do so again in 2025. We held a special St Peter's Day Open Day on 29th June 2024 which, although wet, was well attended. For it we produced a leaflet thanking our funders and highlighting the links between the Kirk and the town of Thurso. We also launched our Aurora notelets and 3D cards for sale and sales of our exclusive 2024 Christmas Card, designed by a local artist are going very well. Thanks also to a local author for copyright permission for their book on the history of the kirk, which we will get reprinted to help raise funds. Over the next 12 months, in addition to pursuing preservation works and welcoming visitors, we hope to launch our website, implement a QR code for donations and source a method of taking card payments both for donations and merchandise.


