Report of the trustees for the year ended 31st December, 2024

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st December 2024. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

Governing document

The charity is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO). It was registered in its current legal form on 29th January 2020. It has a two tier structure and, as such, the members elect the trustees.

Objectives and Activities of the Trust

The organisation's purposes are;

The advancement of religion

The advancement of heritage

The provision of recreational facilities, or the organisation of recreational activities

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Over the last 12 months we have continued to invest in improvements to the fabric of the church building with repairs and renovations. We have purchased a series of information boards which we installed inside the remembrance room, to continue our commitment to helping to educate locals and visitors alike. We have held some fundraising events throughout the year, including a wreath making workshop as well as a celebratory anniversary service on 21st December, 2025.

Trustees

The board of Trustees is made up of the individuals who signed the charity trustee declaration forms which accompanied the application for incorporation of the organisation

The Trustees listed on page one served throughout the year under review except where specified differently.

They did not receive any remuneration or benefits during the year.

Recruitment and appointment of trustees

At each AGM, the members may elect any member (unless he/she is debarred from membership under clause 56) to be a charity trustee.

The board may at any time appoint any member (unless he/she is debarred from membership under clause 56) to be a charity trustee

The Board may at any time co-opt any non-member on the basis that he/she has specialist experience and/or skills which could be of assistance to the board

At each AGM all Trustees shall retire from office - but shall be eligible for re-election

A charity trustee retiring at an AGM will be deemed to have been re-elected unless he/she has advised the board that he/she does not wish to be re-appointed as a charity trustee

Recruitment of members

There should be no fewer than twenty members at any time and at least three quarters should be from the community

Qualification for membership

Membership is open to any individual age 16 and over who has an interest in the religious, historical or architecture of the building

Any person who wished to become a member must sign a written application for membership, the application will then be considered by the board at its next board meeting

The board may, at its discretion, refuse to admit any person to membership

The board must notify each applicant promptly (in writing or by e-mail) of its decision on whether or not to admit him/her to membership

A membership subscription fee will be set at each AGM and decided by the membership

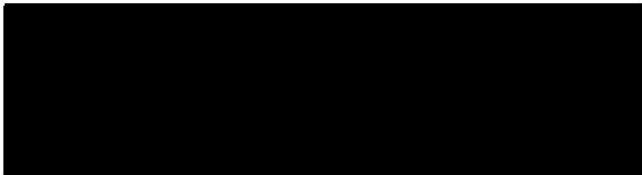
Future Plans

We are looking to become registers as an official camping site and we are actively fundraising with a number of applications being made in September and October, alongside some interactive workshops.

Report of the independent examiner

To the members of Tundergarth Kirks Trust

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31st December 2024 which are set out on pages 5 and 6.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). The charity's trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1)(a) to (c) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under Section 44(1)(c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination was carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

Independent examiner's statement
