

#### **Governing Document**

The Association is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) which became a registered charity on 7 April 2020. The Association was previously an unincorporated association but changed its legal form to a SCIO. The assets of the unincorporated association of the same name were transferred to the SCIO on 7 April 2020. Trustees are elected at a general meeting. There must be a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 10 Trustees. The Constitution also allows for 2 co-opted external Trustees.

#### OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

#### **Charitable Purposes**

The purposes of the Association are the provision of recreational facilities, specifically angling by rod and line, or the organisation of recreational activities, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the persons for whom the facilities or activities are primarily intended.

#### Summary of main activities

The Association's main activity during the year was the provision of salmon, sea trout and wild brown trout angling at various fishing locations on the islands of Lewis and Harris.


