- All in relation to fish flora and fauna in Dumfries & Galloway and South Ayrshire but with particular regard to salmon sea trout brown trout and rainbow trout within the River Cree catchment.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

During the year the charity received grants of £8,640 from The National Lottery, £5,000 from the Holywood Trust and £1,882 from Kilgallioch CBC. We also received donations of £7,500 from River Cree District Salmon Fishery Board and £2,000 from Newton Stewart and District Angling Association. These, together with other donations and our own fundraising efforts produced total funds of £35,804 for use in our charitable activities.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

River Cree District Salmon Fishery Board again requested us to manage its salmon stocking programme. A few of the 180,000 salmon fry from the 2022-2023 programme had been stocked out prior to the end of May 2023 but the bulk were stocked into various nursery burns of the Cree catchment from Junito October 2023. This included some 21,000 fin-clipped salmon fry stocked at autumn fry into the upper Penkiln Burn and into the Cree.

In the autumn salmon broodstock was captured; some 190,000 eggs were stripped, fertilised and grown on as fry in the hatchery, with a view to stocking as requested.

Our Co-ordinator was invited to deliver a paper on the hatchery programme a a national "Salmon Stocking Symposium".

Electro-fishing surveys were carried out on various burns within the Cree catchment, both to monitor wild fish stocks and also fish stocked from the hatchery.

We were once again able to offer work experience placements for students from the local secondary school.

Our forestry project in co-operation with Forestry and Land Scotland continued. Previous plantings on the banks of the Penkiln, Shalloch, Fardin, Eldrick and Pilnyark Burns were reviewed, planting tubes removed where necessary and additional trees planted to replace any that had died.

Measures were taken to control Japanese knotweed and Himalayan balsam along the banks of the Cree.

Our primary education programme was expanded to include six local primary schools. In November some 73 P5 pupils from the schools visited the hatcher to learn about the life cycle of the Atlantic Salmon. They also witnessed eggs being stripped from adult hen salmon, being fertilised with milt from cock salmon and the fertilised eggs being laid out into trays in the hatchery. At a second visit to the hatchery they saw the fry that had developed from the eggs they had seen stripped and fertilised from adult salmon in their visit in the autumn. Each pupil was given a bucket of salmon fry which they stocked into one of the local burns. They then witnessed a "kick-testing" demonstration, collecting invertebrates from the burn. The pupils were able to handle the insects and identify the various types living in the burns.

Our activities were carried out using a number of volunteers. In the course of the year some forty volunteers assisted the work of the trust.
